Upto now, school has been instructed by the Local Authority and Public Health Newcastle about ALL matters related to Covid19 and self-isolating. **Every** positive Covid19 test result for a pupil or member of staff is immediately reported to Public Health Newcastle by the school. Public Health then give instructions to the Headteacher on who should self-isolate.

From Monday, if your child is required to isolate, NHS test and trace will contact you directly. If your child is already self-isolating, they must continue to do so until the 10th day. This is not a school decision but a government rule. Please remember, you must NOT send your child to school if they have Covid19 symptoms. Thank you.
