Well done Y5 for sitting so smartly at the top of the attendance table for last week. With only 1 more week to go for this term, let's make an extra effort to push our school result over 98%.

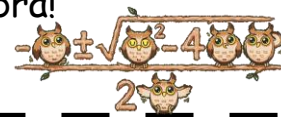
