Surfers Against Sewage

In October Surfers Against Sewage (SAS) came into school to talk to pupils about litter and pollution problems on our beaches and in our local communities. They visited six schools in



the North East and challenged the children to create an Anti-Litter Action Plan to solve litter/pollution issues that concern them. During STEM week Wyndham pupils created a number of fantastic action plans. After much deliberation a school entry was sent to SAS. The chosen team: Oliver, Charlie and Jake from Year 6 devised a BRAB (a crab like machine that could be used on beaches to pick up litter). We recently that out of all the entries they received the BRAB was awarded 2nd place. A very impressive result, well done team BRAB! Christmas Tree Project re-launched by Northumbria Police

A gift upto the value of £10 can then be purchased for your nominated child. The unwrapped present should then be handed to front office staff at Etal Lane between December 2nd and December 9th. Children's Safety

Parking

As you know we've encouraged parents to consider their parking habits when dropping children off/collecting from school. E-Safety message- getting lost in the online world.

Between 5 and 7 year olds, your child is developing the social skills they need to make friends. But 34% of primary school-aged pupils admit to feeling addicted to the internet. You might want to agree on some ground rules for how your child uses their gadget. If you need help, think about:

- *How long are you happy for them to use it each day?
- *Is there a time of day you don't want them to use it?
- *Where can they use it?
- *Can they have it in their bedroom overnight?
- *Do they have a limit on how much they can spend each month?
- *Consider family rules like not using devices at the dinner table.
- *What are the consequences if they break these rules?

As you discuss the rules, make sure you explain the reasons behind them. Set a date to review them to check they're working.
