Year 6 Child Pedestrian Training

On Monday afternoon Year 6 took part in a Child Pedestrian Training session. This involved small groups of Year 6 children walking around the local streets with a Road Safety Instructor while discussing the road safety aspects of walking to school independently. The purpose of the training is to provide children in the final year of school with safer road safety skills in preparation for their move to their next school which can often be some distance away from their homes. The children were very observant while out and about, often commenting on speeding cars and drivers using mobile phones while driving - factors which can increase the risk of danger to pedestrians. Children were given information leaflets to share with family and friends and have been encouraged to discuss facts and findings with you.

could we ask parents to support us in asking children to show positive behaviours when coming to and returning from school especially those pupils who are responsible for making their journeys unsupervised.

Lateness

It is a parent's responsibility to ensure their children arrive at school on time. Lateness can disrupt the learning of others and can result in a pupil feeling greater stress and achieving poorer outcomes.

Research shows a close link between attendance at school and a child's achievement. Being late adds up to a loss of learning. All time out of school affects learning and achievement for both pupils. Please make sure your child arrives at school on time. If a pupil arrives after registration has closed the absence will be recorded as unauthorised for that session. If this persists legal action, in the form of a Penalty Notice or Prosecution under Section 444(1) of the Education Act 1996 may follow. At the beginning of the new term, we will require parents to sign in children who arrive at school after the pupils entrance has closed, providing a reason for lateness.
