#### Punctuality

A decline in Wyndham's punctuality recently is becoming a concern. Good punctuality at school is essential for students to achieve their full educational potential. It is also vital for students to form good habits for later life. Students arriving late are recorded on the register, along with how many minutes late they are. According to DfE guidelines, registers must be closed after a certain time in the morning. Therefore, if a student arrives after 9.15am, they cannot receive a late mark but have to be marked as absent for the whole morning session. Without a legitimate reason the session is marked as an unauthorised absence. 10 or unauthorised absences mean parents may be liable for a fixed penalty notice. If you are experiencing difficulties with punctuality, please speak to a member of school staff.
