For the second year running, a Christmas tree will be placed in Etal Lane police station from Saturday 18th November. It will be decorated with tags representing vulnerable children living in the area and the public are invited to select a tag. Tags can be picked directly from the tree up until December 2nd. A gift up to the value of £10 can then be purchased for your nominated child. The unwrapped present should then be handed to front office staff at Etal Lane between December 2nd and December 9th. Thank you to Taylor for doing this with our class bear Bertie over the weekend and drawing our attention to this wonderful cause.

Road Safety

This year Road Safety Week 2017, focused on SPEED DOWN - SAVE LIVES. Pupils across the school looked at a variety of activities (age appropriate) during PSHE that reminded them how to cross the road safely, how to take care when walking or playing near a road and analysing Road Safety Statistics. Year 6 debated: 'Should Primary School children be allowed to walk to school alone?' A fantastic discussion ensued - the outcome: some no, some abstained but the majority said yes! Your support encouraging safe road crossing would be very much appreciated, especially around the busy school entrances.



E-Safety message

Explore sites and apps together

Talk about what might be OK for children of different ages. Ask your child what sites or apps they like. Write a list, and look at them together. Be positive about what you see, but also be open about concerns you have: "I think this site's really good" or "I'm a little worried about things I've seen here". Talk to your child about what you think is appropriate – but also involve them in the conversation. Ask what they think is OK for children of different ages – they'll feel involved in the decision-making. Be aware that your child might talk about friends who use apps or visit sites that you've decided aren't suitable. Be ready to discuss your reasons, but recognise that they may not agree with you. Listen carefully for the reasons why. Go through a final list of sites you both agree are OK, and work out when you'll next discuss it.
