Year 6 transition to Kenton

As you are aware all Year 6 pupils, who will begin Kenton in September, will be attending their transition days from Monday 1st July until Friday 12th July. You should have all received a letter in the post from Kenton School. If you haven't not to worry, the key information is:

- Children are to wear Wyndham School uniform for the whole transition period and they need to take Wyndham PE kit on Monday 1st July.
 - Children need to arrive at Kenton School for 8.15am.
 - The school day will begin 8.30am until 3.00pm each day.
 - Mrs Gathercole will meet the children at Kenton School on the first morning of transition.
 - If your child normally pays for school lunches and intends to have lunches while at Kenton, payment needs to be paid to Wyndham Primary School as usual. If your child qualifies for free school meals, this will continue at Kenton School. Children can also take packed lunches if they wish.
 - Information regarding travel by bus is available on Kenton's website should you need it.
- Any pupils not intending to go to Kenton should come to Wyndham as normal.

We need your help to improve punctuality!

It's a great start to the day, putting your child in a positive frame of mind to make the most of the day's learning and activities. Punctuality is linked to good attendance, and as we know, good attenders have more opportunities, more support and therefore achieve more! **ALSO...**It helps your child make friends (in the playground) which leads to improved self-confidence and therefore **SUCCESS! AND...**It sets your child up for their future - whether it is college, work or university, they could lose their place or lose their job if they think it's ok to be late! There are two types of lateness...**1. Late before register closes** Your child is a few minutes late - but they have missed the opportunity to say hello to and play with friends. They are likely to feel unsettled and embarrassed as they start morning lessons. **2. Late after register closes at 9:20am.** This counts as an unauthorised absence and will show on your child's attendance record. Not only has your child missed the chance to meet with their friends before school, they are likely to have missed the start of lessons and could feel unsettled, embarrassed and much less confident than their classmates as the lesson moves on. This can lead to legal monitoring from the Local Authority.
