If the lateness is due to a legitimate reason e.g. a medical appointment, the absence can be authorised. Otherwise, the session is marked as an unauthorised absence. Commencing

Monday 18th June parents/carers must complete a 'Late Slip' at the main office on their child's arrival to school after 8:55am. Good punctuality at school is essential for children to achieve their full educational potential. It is also vital for students to form good habits for later life.
