



## Sport Premium Impact Statement 2017-18

The attached report refers to the Sport Premium Funding at Wyndham Primary School 2017-18. In total a grant of £17,740 was received.

The grant has been used to;

\* Meet national curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety for pupils in Year 6 (82% of cohort could swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25m).

\* Focus on 5 key indicators:

1. Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity (30 – 60 minutes a day).
2. Raise the profile of PE across the school.
3. Increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in the teaching of PE.
4. Offer a broader experience of a range of sports and activities.
5. Increase pupil participation in competitive sport.

\* Utilised professional coaches and programs to deliver after school clubs and PE sessions: Futsal, Karate, taster sessions e.g. Tag Rugby and Primary Stars NUFC Football Foundation.

\* Alive for Learning week – exposure to a variety of alternative physical activities including: hula hooping; handball; yoga; climbing; basketball. Also involved parents to promote the importance of healthy active lifestyles.

\* Monitored the work of those delivering PE to ensure that teaching is consistently good or better.

\* All staff PE Twilight sessions – tennis, athletics and cricket. CPD opportunities.

\* Identified and encouraged those pupils who were reluctant to participate in sport.

\* Improved pupils' health, especially pupils who were known to be overweight or obese, by promoting a positive attitude to physical activity.

\* Promoted physical activity and importance of regular exercise away from PE lessons: WOW (walk to school) campaign; Golden Mile; active play and lunchtimes supported by staff.

\* Provided opportunities for competitive sport, allowing children to put into practice the skills from lessons – Inter academy competitions; boys and girls football leagues; School Games. Including participation of less able pupils in competitive events.

\* Offered a comprehensive provision of after school, lunchtime and extracurricular clubs and opportunities.



- \* Developed PE apprentice skills to support delivery of PE sessions and clubs.
- \* Year 6 pupils trained up as Sports Leaders to help with younger pupils sports clubs and outdoor activities.
- \* Bronze Service Level Agreement with Newcastle PE and School Sport Service – to develop vision for PE across the school.
- \* Bronze PE Mark awarded.
- \* PE Network meetings offered links and opportunities to share good practice with other schools.
- \* PE Notice board, showing off what pupils have done and what they are going to do.
- \* Inter-house competitions KS1, Years 3 and 4, Years 5 and 6.
