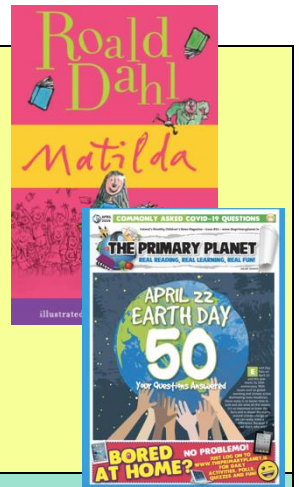


# Reading at Salusbury

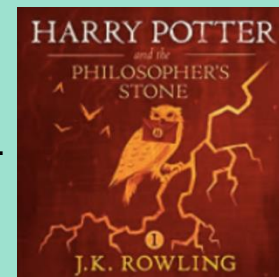
## Read

- Sing-along [Nursery Rhymes](#) on YouTube, wonderful for Early Years and KS1!



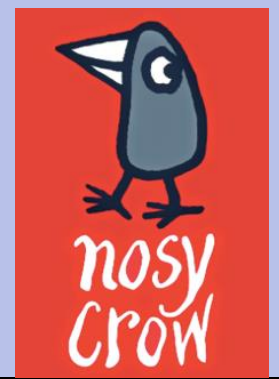
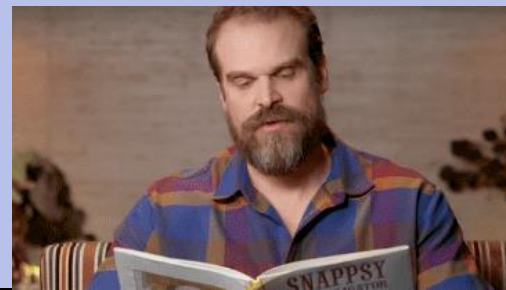
## Watch:

- The Nosy Crow website are also releasing a [free video of picture books](#) every morning at breakfast.

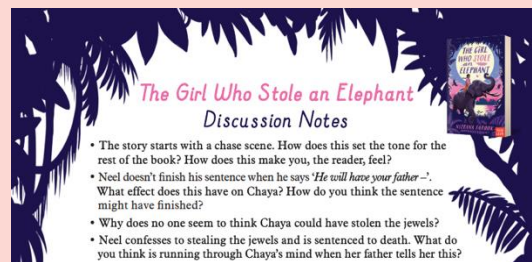
**Many authors have recorded themselves reading their books. These websites provide a link to many of them:**
