Policy

Overview

The school began receiving the Sports Premium in September 2013. This is a basic grant to all schools and is topped up by a per pupil element. The purpose of this funding is to ensure improvement in the quality of sport and PE provision for all children. (Department for Education, March 2013).

It can be used in many ways but the school is accountable for the way in which it is spent and we are required to publish this information on our website. In 2016/17, Broadway East has been given £8,880 of PE and Sports Premium.

The DfE has defined how the grant can and cannot be spent:

What can the grant be spent on?

Schools are free to decide how to spend the grant, but they must be able to show that their spending has led to a "direct and sustained" improvement in sporting provision.

The DfE's guidance, linked to above, lists possible uses of the grant. It says that the funding should: develop or add to the PE and sport activities that schools already offer/make improvements that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

Suggested uses of the funding include:

Hiring qualified sports coaches to work with teachers

Providing teachers with resources and training in PE and sport

Running after-school sports clubs and holiday clubs to support the least active children

Running sports activities with other schools

What can the grant not be spent on?

The DfE guidance specifies that the grant cannot be spent on:

Employing specialist coaches or teachers to cover planning, preparation and assessment (PPA) arrangements as PPA should be covered by core staffing budgets

Teaching the minimum requirements of the national curriculum, including swimming

In line with DfE guidance we publish on our website:

- Our PE and sport premium funding amount for the current academic year
- How we intend to spend the allocation
- How the previous academic year's allocation was spent
- The difference the funding made to the PE and sport participation and attainment of the pupils who attract the funding

Our Vision

We share the same broad vision as Newcastle PE and Sport Service:

By 2020 there will be a measureable and sustained improvement in school PE and sport, underpinned by high quality teaching that increases participation levels in physical activity and competition which leads to healthier pupils who are more engaged across the whole curriculum.

School Aims:

The targeted and strategic use of the funding supports us in meeting the following aims:

- To stimulate and maintain increased pupil interest in PE and to promote healthy lifestyles which ultimately increase pupils' chances of leading healthy, fulfilled lives now and in the future.
- To provide opportunities to allow pupils to broaden their PE experiences both during curriculum and extra curriculum time.
- To identify and support those pupils who show specific aptitude for individual sports as well as...
- To increase pupil self-esteem through the development of physical confidence.
- Develop physical literacy so that all children have basic skills in PE (balance, agility and coordination).
- To support staff so that skills, knowledge and understanding are strengthened and the PE curriculum delivery is high quality and allows pupils to meet the above aims.

Principles

We will ensure that sport and PE provision addresses the needs of all pupils, including those who belong to disadvantaged, vulnerable and gifted groups.

Primary School Sports funding will be allocated following a whole school needs analysis which will identify priority classes, groups and individuals. In order to address any (identified) areas of need, this funding may be used across particular individuals, groups, classes, key stages or whole school.
