

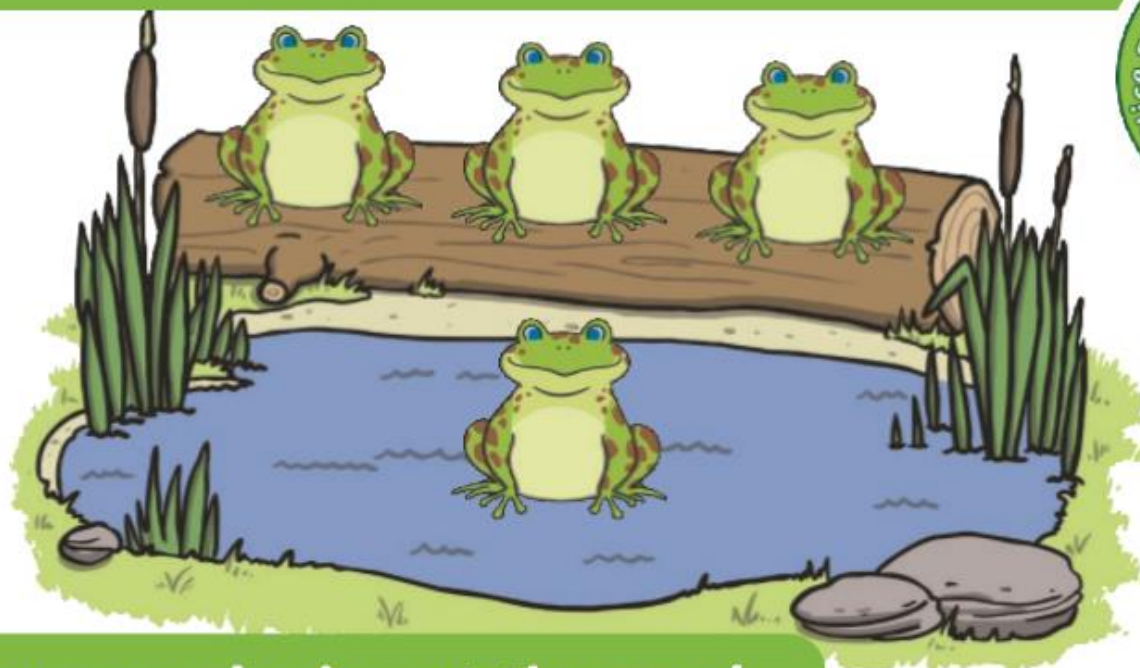
## Extra maths challenge (Optional) : 12.1.21

How many chilli challenges can you complete? Start with the green and see if you can get to the orange (burning up!) chilli challenge.

You could choose to print off the logs/frogs or act this out with teddies/toys that you have at home.

Some questions your grown-up might choose to ask you while you are doing the challenges:

- How many frogs can you see in the picture? How many frogs is that altogether?
- Can you say a number sentence about the frogs?
- Can you find a different way of arranging the four frogs?
- What can you tell me about the frogs? Where are they?
- Can you try the same thing with five frogs?
- If there are three frogs on the log, how many must be hiding under the water?
- I think two frogs are hiding under the water. How can we check
