Year 3 - The Stone Age



In year 3 our topic for this term is The Stone Age.

We have started our topic this week by spending some time in the computer suite and researching what stone age cave paintings looked like. Over the weeks we will be building on our knowledge of The Stone Age by using books and online resources to research.

We will also be learning about food and nutrition within The Stone Age and choosing some of the ingredients they had available to make some stone age cakes!
