Cruddas Park Early Years Centre Behaviour Management Policy



Rationale:

We aim to create a calm, safe and stimulating environment in which children can play and learn together.

Purposes:

- 1. To ensure every child enjoys positive, social relationships and feels included in the school and community
- 2. To encourage respect for the individual.
- 3. To enable staff to create a positive working environment.
- 4. To develop a caring and considerate approach to others.
- 5. To ensure consistency of approach to behaviour management.

6.

Guidelines:

- Positive behaviour will be reinforced.
- Centre based staff will be role models for the children e.g. calm and quiet approach
- Staff will ensure children are clearly aware of and understand any rules or procedures.
- Disapproval will be of the action (actual behaviour being displayed) rather the child.
- Opportunities will be created to raise the self esteem of pupils.
- Behaviour management techniques will be used in appropriate and consistent ways, going through a series of steps e.g.
 - Reasoning and negotiation
 - Advance warning of any consequences such as withdrawal from an activity or area
- Parents / carers will be informed of any continual behaviour problems and a partnership approach with parents / carers will be developed to address issues together.
- Sanction will be appropriate to the behaviour.
- If necessary, short periods of 'time out' will be discussed with the parents / carers and used.
- In the case of children identified as having 'behavioural special needs' the staff will monitor such behaviour within the Care File and may draw up an Individual Behaviour Plan, designed to support improvements in a child's behaviour over a period of time so that unacceptable behaviour does not remain unacknowledged or unsupported.
- Appropriate agencies will be consulted for severe recurrent problems if positive progress is not made and after discussion with parents / carers, SENCO and Head teacher.
 - This policy will also be considered alongside our Positive Handling Policy when appropriate.

Conclusion:

We aim to provide a happy, caring environment in which children develop confidence and an awareness of appropriate behaviour. The policy will be monitored bi-annually with the whole staff team and governors.

This, and all other Safeguarding policies and procedures, will be reviewed annually.
