AMAZING RESULTS!

We have known all along that this years' year six pupils were going to 'smash it' when it came to their SATs, however, the final results are really brilliant and were beyond even our own expectations.

Our school results, shown below as meeting the Expected Standard (EXS) and working at Greater Depth (GDS), were:

Reading: EXS 72%, GDS 24%

Writing: EXS 76%, GDS 17%

Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling: EXS 83%, GDS 38%

Maths: EXS 79%, GDS 7%

Nursery and Reception

How does your garden grow?

Nursery and Reception have had an exceptionally busy term. We have been finding out what plants need to grow, then growing plants and creating gardens. We wanted to plant a rainbow of flowers for bees and butterflies to visit. We created a minibeasts hotel, decorated shapes, added a sand pit, made a painting station and a mark making wall to improve our nursery garden too!

We found out that bees are very important and we need to protect them! Do you know what makes bees buzz? Well if not, we can tell you because we searched it on the internet! 'Bees buzz while flying and while collecting and depositing pollen among flowers. A bee produces a buzzing sound through the quick movement of its wings. The slower its wings beat, the lower the pitch of the buzzing sound.'

Jill the artist came in to help us answer the question. We wanted to express our thoughts using media and materials to create banners and bunting. The children worked enthusiastically to get their ideas down on silk using gold pens and then used inks to infill their creative drawings and designs. The finished banners and bunting show an array of colourful minibeasts, plants and flowers against a backdrop of greenery, water and sunshine. Our banners answer the question beautifully!



Year 1

What makes a home sweet home?

The children have been thinking about all the things that make a home sweet home and along the way they have interviewed residents at Kirkwood Court, a local housing MP, found out what it takes to make a home and designed their dream homes and tried to sell them, which they managed extremely well. Mrs Shield has even been promised one of them in the future! It has also been lovely to see the empathy the children in Year 1 have shown throughout their project. They have learned about less fortunate people in our area who are not lucky enough to have somewhere to live and they have raised a LOT of money for the homeless charity 'Changing Lives'. A massive thank you to all those people who have helped to raise money for this excellent cause. The children and charity are so grateful.



Year 2

Is plastic fantastic?

Over the Summer term Year 2 have researched the use of plastic around the world and looked at both the positive and negative effects of the material. The class have enjoyed working together as a team to investigate the uses of plastic and have discovered that this material can be extremely harmful to our environment. We studied the oceans and our favourite sea creatures to learn more about the environmental effects of plastic pollution and decided to spread awareness of this topical issue through the making of a whole class sculpture. We made the sculpture from plastic bottles that we collected as a class which we recycled into beautiful fish. The sculpture currently hanging in the school reception and is set to be displayed at the Great North Museum for a European Marine Science Educators conference. We are very proud of all our hard work and hope we have made a difference.





Year 3: How can we make the world a more beautiful place?

When we went to Scotswood Community Garden at the start of our project, we were asked to complete a task to help wildlife back at school. Over the term, we have worked to create a herb garden to attract bees. Rosie was able to come and officially open our herb garden by cutting the ribbon and also presented us all with a certificate for all our hard work.



Year 4- What unites us?

To unite KS2, Class 4 organised a super Dodgeball tournament for Year 3, 4 and 5. Each class was given a country name which was in the World Cup as we have been learning all about how sport can unite and bring people together. The tournament was great and everybody had so much fun, there were lots of great sporting attitudes and team work; it really did unite us all. The house-team winners in each class were Alnwick, who were playing as England! Well done team Alnwick!!!

Before the tournament, Class 4 completed lots of investigations around sound so that they could make instruments to play during the matches (just like at real England football matches). We learnt that sound is made when the air vibrates and that sound can travel through air, water and solids! We made trumpets and shakers to cheer on the players during their dodgeball matches.



Year 5 : Rivers have a mouth but do they have a tale?

Just like a river, we have been on an amazing journey: we started with a trip to the source of a river; we have explored the features of different rivers; researched the wildlife and how we can protect this precious ecosystem as well as investigating some of the hidden dangers such as flooding and pollution; not to mention writing some incredible emotive poetry. All of this gave us the knowledge we needed to complete our Northumberland myths about where the rivers Tyne and Wear came from. It has taken a lot of drafting and editing but we are now busy getting them published

— we can't wait to share them with you!
