IMPROVED SECURITY MEASURES

After half term we will be making the site more secure by locking the main school vehicle gates from **8:40am-3.30pm.**

This means that all visitors to school during those hours will need to park outside the school site, and access the school via the pedestrian gate.

This gate will be unlocked but must be closed behind you.

In order to allow the office staff to focus on core school business, the main school office will also be operating restricted hours. Opening hours will be:

morning from 8.15am-9.30am, lunchtime 12—1pm and home time 3pm-4pm.

Please make sure your child brings everything necessary in the morning as staff cannot leave their tasks to deliver things such as packed lunches, PE kits or messages to classes.

Year 6: 91.6% (oh dear!)


Nursey
