



Mountfield Primary school Accessibility Plan 2018-2021

Introduction

This plan has been written to meet the requirements to carry out accessibility planning for disabled pupils as stated in the Equality Act 2010 and the SEND code of practice 2014.

Mountfield Primary school recognises its duty:

- Not to discriminate against disabled pupils in the admissions and exclusions and provision of education and associated services
- Not to treat disabled pupils less-favourably
- To take reasonable steps to avoid putting disabled pupils at a substantial disadvantage
- To publish an accessibility plan

Mountfield Primary School aims to:

- Increase the extent to which disabled pupils can participate in the curriculum.
- Improve the physical environment of the school to enable disabled pupils to take better advantage of education, benefits, facilities and services provided
- Improve the availability of accessible information for disabled pupils.

This plan will be reviewed regularly and will be updated every three years. It runs alongside our Equalities policy, Disability Equality Scheme, SEND policy, Equal Opportunities, Administration of Medicines, Safeguarding and Child Protection policies.

Definition of Disability under the Equality Act 2010 states that a person has a disability if:

- They have a long term physical or mental impairment that has an adverse, substantial and long term effect on their ability to carry out normal day to day activities.

Mountfield Primary School provides all pupils with a broad and balanced curriculum, differentiated and adjusted to meet the needs of individual pupils and their preferred learning styles. We endorse the key principles that underpin the development of a more inclusive curriculum:

- Setting suitable learning challenges
- Responding to pupils' diverse learning needs
- Overcoming potential barriers to learning and assessment for individuals and groups of pupils.

The three areas to be considered in the plan are:

- Improving education and related activities** – Mountfield Primary School will seek and follow the advice of LA services, such as specialist teacher advisers and SEN advisers, and of appropriate health professionals from the NHS Trusts.
- Improving the physical environment** – Mountfield Primary School will take account of the needs of pupils and visitors with physical difficulties and sensory impairments when planning and undertaking future improvements and refurbishments of the site and premises, such as improving access, lighting, acoustic treatment and colour schemes as well as more accessible fixtures and fittings.

c) Improving the provision of information – Mountfield Primary School will make itself aware of local services, including those provided through the Local Authority, for providing information in alternative formats when required or requested.

Contextual information

Mountfield Primary School is an inclusive school. It comprises a two storey building with wheelchair access to the main and rear entrances. Spaces in classrooms and cloakrooms is such that specific arrangements would have to be made if a pupil who uses a wheelchair joined the school, to ensure adequate space to manoeuvre. As a school, we have an excellent record with regard to making reasonable adjustments for pupils with disabilities. The playground area is tarmac and slopes to the rear entrance. We have a commitment to continuous improvement. Through self-review and training we aim to enhance staff knowledge, skills and understanding to promote excellent teaching and learning for all our children. We aim to meet every child’s needs within mixed ability, inclusive classes. It is a central belief of the school that children are enabled to participate fully in the broader life of the school including age appropriate after school clubs, leisure and cultural activities and school visits.

Information about the school’s disabled population

Mountfield Primary school over the years has included children with difficulties in Communication and Interaction, Cognition and Learning Needs, Social Emotional and Mental Health Needs and Sensory and Physical Needs. This has involved us working with a variety of professionals to ensure the best possible education for disabled pupils. Home visits are undertaken for all children beginning Nursery and Reception and if children have additional needs, the LA and health advisers are contacted for support and guidance. We have a number of children for whom we hold inhalers to alleviate their asthmatic condition. Competent first aiders hold current first aid certificates. All medication is kept in a safe and secure place which has easy access to first aiders and staff members. We only administer prescribed medication.

How appropriate is the current provision?

Staff are highly aware of the issues faced by our disabled pupils and act to resolve them, eg: Adapting the timetable, lesson content and presentation of resources to ensure better accessibility, planning visits and clubs which are inclusive. Regular CPD addresses the inclusion agenda.

Targets for 2018-2021

Monitoring will be undertaken by the Finance, Premises and Staffing Sub-Committee of the Local Governing Board with advice from key professionals.
