

## Uniform

The Governing Body places great importance on the wearing of school uniform. It is a very valuable sign that children have pride in their membership of the school, in its new and modern surroundings, and in the team spirit it creates. It reflects our Christian ethos, a tradition we believe to be ever more important in swiftly changing times.

WE ASK THAT ALL ITEMS OF CLOTHING AND PERSONAL ITEMS ARE MARKED WITH YOUR CHILD'S NAME

Boys Uniform:	Royal blue sweatshirt Royal blue polo shirt Grey trousers (grey shorts may be worn in the summer) Grey socks Black shoes (sandals may be worn in the summer) Trainers/football shoes are not permitted PE T-shirt Navy blue shorts for PE
Girls Uniform:	Royal blue sweatshirt Royal blue polo shirt Grey trousers or skirt (Girls may wear a grey pinafore dress with royal blue polo shirt) Pale blue and white check summer weight dress with a royal blue cardigan White socks, grey tights Black shoes with flat, low heels (sandals may be worn in the summer) Trainers are not permitted PE T-Shirt Navy blue shorts for PE

Uniform may be purchased from the 'Riviera Schooldays' shop, 134 Union St, Torquay. Leaflets and prices are available from the school foyer.

Note: Advice given to the Governing Body is that it is inadvisable for young children to wear high heels at a time when their bones are not fully developed. As a result they will not accept any claims as a result of injuries to ankles, which could be directly, or indirectly the result of wearing high heels.

### Jewellery:

Governors' policy on the wearing of acceptable jewellery.

This policy denotes what children may wear. We expect that children wear a minimum of jewellery, but have developed these guidelines to explain what is and what is not acceptable.

The children may wear:

- A watch
- One simple ring with no sharp edges or obtrusive bulkiness
- One stud or one sleeper earring in each ear; no fashion earrings, hoops or drop earrings
- A thin (2/3 mm) chain with a cross.

Pupils will be asked to remove watches, rings, bracelets and chains for any activity where there could be a health or safety risk to themselves or others. The staff will also ask pupils to cover up any studs exposed in an activity that could also be a safety risk. It is preferred that earrings and studs are not worn at all.

If the need for referral occurs, the Head teacher's decision will be final on type, size, shape, acceptability or health or safety grounds.

This policy follows consultation with the Secondary school sector and in line with accepted practice.

### PE and Games

#### Games Kit for Key Stage 2
