You need to keep safe online because something inappropriate or something with bad language in could pop up.



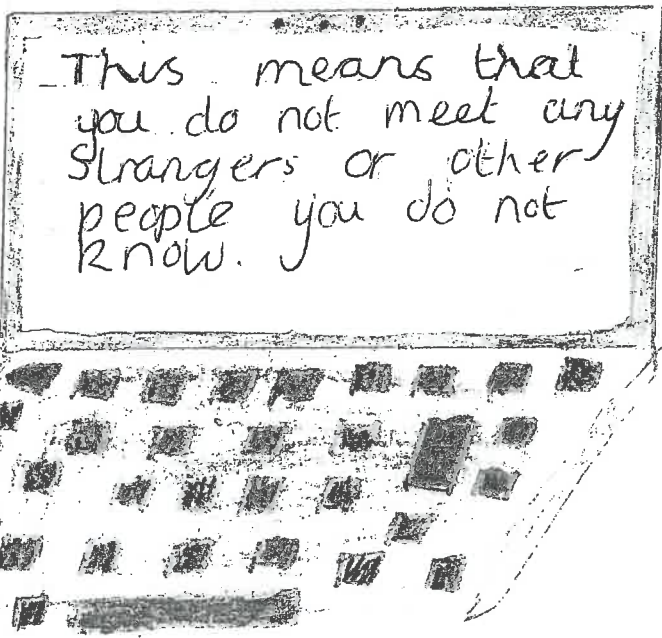
Do you have a problem?

If you see someone you don't trust delete them.

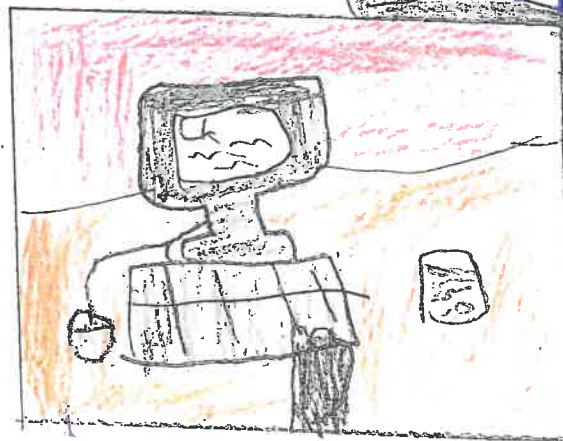

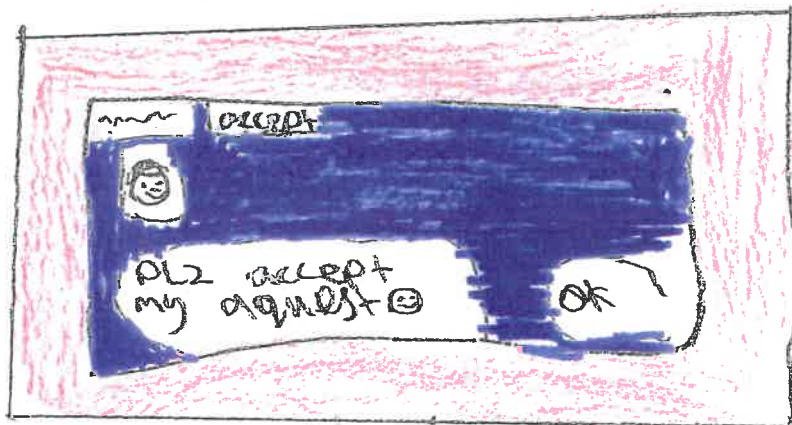

R... stands for rely. Rely is when you can't trust the internet. Whether just scrolling on a website or talking to an online friend that you don't know, you may not know what could happen. When you talking to someone that you may not know never believe the information that they are telling you as they maybe telling you lies.



If someone asks you for your personal information and you don't fully trust them or you don't know them, don't tell them anything at all.

Always tell adult or someone that you trust if someone that you can't rely on / telling the truth, always tell someone you trust and they will sort it out for you.

Never rely on a stranger!!!



T is for tell. You should tell the people on your network if you are worried or uncomfortable with things on the internet. If they are not sure what to do then they can call Childline . If it is completely necessary then call CEOP.

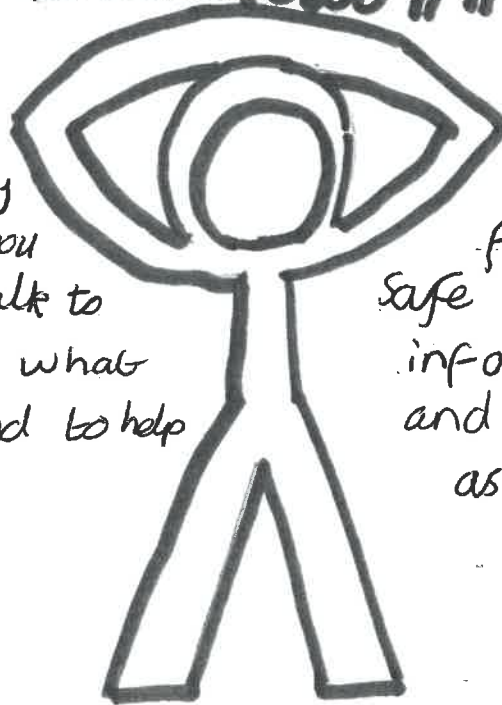
