Primary PE and Sport Premium 2014-2015

Trafalgar Community Infant School is fortunate enough to receive additional funding through the Primary PE and Sports Premium which was introduced in September 2013. For the next three academic years, schools and academies in England will receive £8000 plus an additional payment of £5 per child on roll. This extra funding must be used to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and the sports we have to offer. Schools and academies can spend their funding as they wish as long as the additional provision we provide caters for all pupils that we are responsible for.
