

# Spring Homework Menu: Time Travellers

## **History, Science, PSHE and Geography**

### History

Research Victorian toys to find out what the children used to play with.

Create a fact file about castles. You could invent your own castle as well and tell us all about the different areas.

Design your own family shield. Make sure you make it bright and eye catching.



### Science

Search your house for different materials, describe what they feel and look like. Can you create a table with different types of materials in?

Design a toy that would be made out of lots of different materials. You could even make the toy!

### PSHE

Set yourself some realistic and achievable goals - these could be to do with school, home or hobbies.

### Art

Try some weaving with paper, or other materials such as ribbon.

Create some artwork using a range of mediums such as pencils, paints, crayons, chalk, charcoal, paint or even create a collage.

### Math's

Practise saying, writing and showing (with handprints for 5s for example) number patterns of 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s.

Can you recite your times tables? Backwards, forwards, random! Spot numbers in your everyday life - perhaps you could make a journal of the numbers around you!

Familiarise yourself with coins as we will be learning all about money. Maybe you could try and pay for something with your grown-up when you go to the shops.

Practise your adding and subtracting, especially with 2-digit numbers, remembering to draw your tens and ones to help!

Search around your house for 2d and 3d shapes. Create a page all about the shapes that you can find.

Start having a look at fractions. Think about halves and quarters

### English

Read as often as you can and enjoy books (fiction and non-fiction, including things such as atlases, encyclopedias, brochures and comics) with your child. Share the reading and quiz each other.

Write a recount about something you have done. You might write about your weekend, a birthday party or even a trip to a museum or cinema.

Keep practising your handwriting using different pens, pencils or even paint!

Have a go at coming up with a fun and silly poem! Try writing different styles of poems: list, spine, acrostic, rhyming

### Other ideas for you to enjoy with your children at home:

- ❖ Go for a walk on the beach or into the countryside, maybe even at night time!
- ❖ Visit a museum.
- ❖ Write a film review about a film that you loved!
- ❖ Go swimming.
- ❖ Go on a bug hunt, explore some microhabitats.
- ❖ Create some rubbings of trees, coins and different materials.
- ❖ Take photographs of somewhere you have been and create presentation using these.
- ❖ Create a talent show for your grown-ups.
- ❖ Write a news report about any aspect of school life.
