### In-School Barriers

Lack of knowledge of English vocabulary and grammar for beginner/intermediate EAL pupils.

Lack of fluency in reading, spelling and basic number for FSM pupils.

Rising number of children needing social and emotional support (21% of the school population have identified safeguarding issues).

### External Barriers

Home learning environment/support.

A: At least 65% of pupils eligible for PP achieve EXS in reading, maths and writing.

B: Equality of opportunity for FSM pupils.

C: Emotional needs of children are met successfully.
