## Year 1



In Year 1 we have been learning about the life and work of post-impressionist artist Vincent Van Gogh.

We found out that Van Gogh liked to paint landscapes and self-portraits and that he only sold one painting in his whole life. We looked carefully at his style of painting and recreated some of his most famous art pieces using collage, watercolour paint, oil pastels and pencil. We also created prints of sunflowers using handmade foam printers and oil paint and drew careful observational pictures of sunflowers.

Both the Year 1 classes worked together with the fabulous Fiona to create a large collage of Starry Starry Night using paper and card.

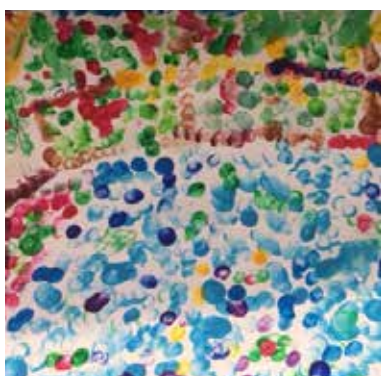
## Year 2

We are all really pleased and proud of the work we have produced and look forward to exhibiting it for you to see at the Clifton Art Trail.



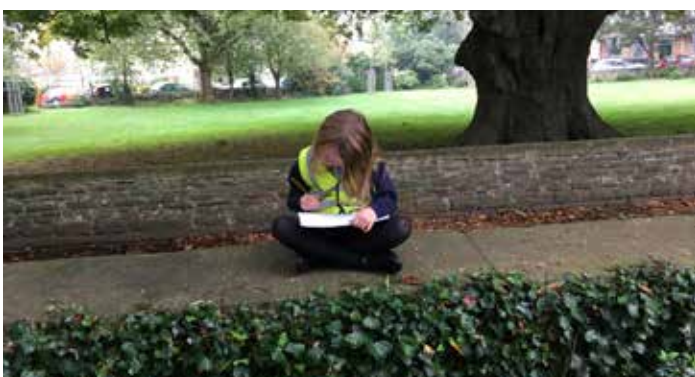


## Year 3



Throughout the week, Year 3 have taken inspiration from Thomas Gainsborough's painting 'Mr and Mrs Andrews'. The painting focuses on portraits as well as landscapes. We predominately focused on the landscape element of the painting and used nature as our starting point as we took a trip to Victoria Square. Whilst at the park we sketched on location, took rubbings and collected leaves which we then used in our art work. This is evident in the variety of printing techniques that we have experimented with.

## Year 4



Year 4 have been having a ball throughout arts week! We were inspired by the painting "Allegory of War" by Jan Brueghel, who painted in the Baroque era.

We spotted majestic birds in the painting, so we made cushions with designs of eagles and gargoyles, using a Flour Paste Resist technique, and also used simple outlines of birds of prey and watercolour pencils to create bird paintings.

We saw skulls in our picture and so we put together a model of a skull, papier mached it and painted on Day of the Dead designs.

Because we saw a wolf and a lion in the picture, we made massive whole class collages of these animals using tissue paper and our collaging skills. We have all agreed that we wish it every week was arts week!





## Year 5

Year 5 have had a fantastic week, studying Hans Holbein's "The Ambassadors".

We started the week doing wire sculpture which was quite tricky at times but our finished pieces look really effective.

We then moved on to creating busts of Jean de Dinteville and Georges de Selve (the Ambassadors) using paper mache. Making the shoulders, eyes and nose was our greatest challenge but we think we have overcome these hurdles and persevered with our paper mache skills to create the 3d faces we hoped for.

We have also worked with Annmarie, a local interior designer, creating collages of our faces using animal facial features and objects from the natural environment.

Come and see our work on display at the Arts Trail; we've had a great week!





## Year 6



Year 6 have enjoyed a fabulous Art Week focusing on the picture 'Arnolfini Portrait' by Jan Van Eyck as part of our exploration of Gothic Art.

We have undertaken a variety of activities including looking at Art History, studying the life and times of the artist, considering the symbolism inherent in the picture and re-creating the entire portrait in a collage! (That was fun!)

We also went to Clifton College to print pictures of the dog in the portrait who symbolised fidelity. Under the tutelage of the artist Mary Collet, we learnt about the technique of reversing drawings and transferring onto lino squares. We then learnt how to safely gouge out the white areas of our drawing and finally Mary printed them for us using a printing machine that was similar to a mangle. Some of us worked in school with Mrs Clements to print as well. Please come to the Art Trail to see the results of our hardwork.
