They also visited the Underfall Yard (and now know what an underfall is!) and had a boat ride around the docks learning even more information about Bristol's fascinating history.

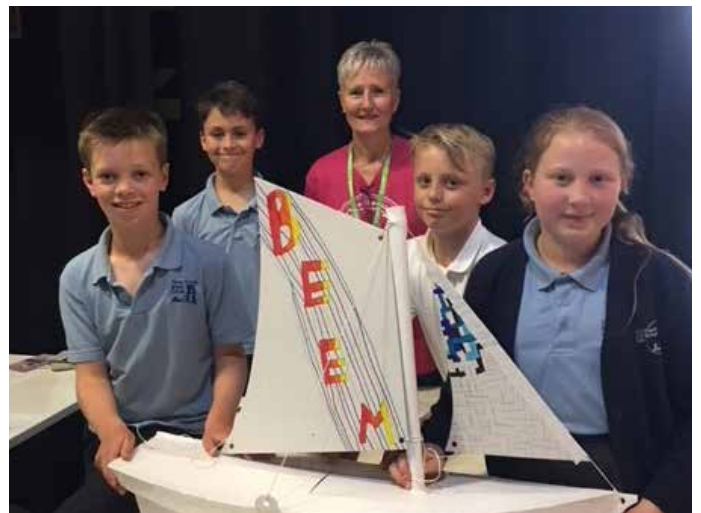
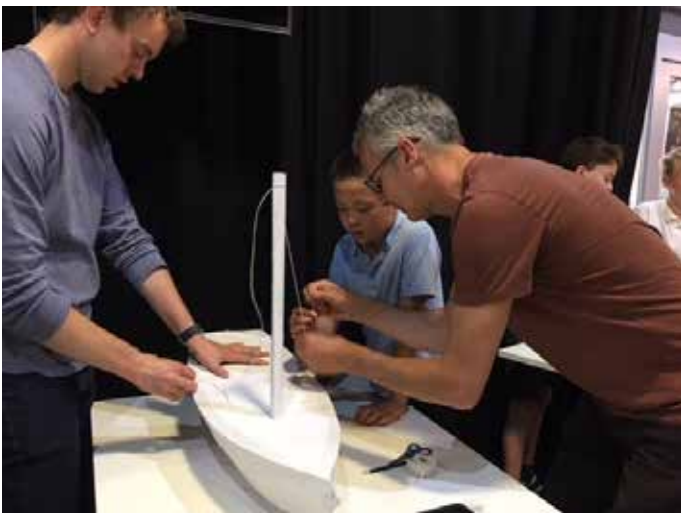
