Invention of the game

The game of basketball as it is known today was created by Dr. James Naismith in December 1891 in Springfield, Massachusetts, to condition young athletes during cold months. It consisted of peach baskets and a soccer style ball. The objective of the game was to throw the basketball into the fruit baskets nailed to the lower railing of the gym balcony. Every time a point was scored, the game was halted so the janitor could bring out a ladder and retrieve the ball. After a while, the bottoms of the fruit baskets were removed.

It was lovely to go and watch our Years 5 & 6 compete in a game that I really knew nothing about and had never watched before. It was fast paced and exciting; the 5 children in each team threw themselves into it, dribbling, passing, shooting, battling balls out of the opposition's hands, constantly on the move. Our local Basketball Team, Bristol Flyers, had done some workshops with Yr 5 in Term 1 and the children had obviously learnt a lot. Max Howard brought his experience from his time spent in America and Josh Hammond was a demon dribbler! Well done to the Year 5 & 6 girls who have competed both in the recent Rugby League and now this Basketball League - you do yourselves and our school proud! 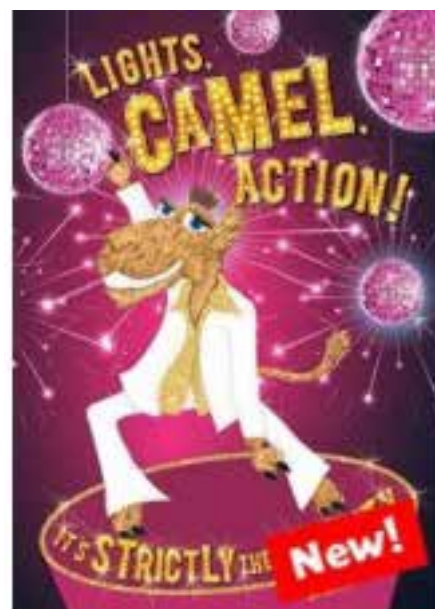
As part of the day the children will learn about the English Author Rudyard Kipling who in 1894 wrote a The Jungle Book, a collection of stories that were fables using animals.

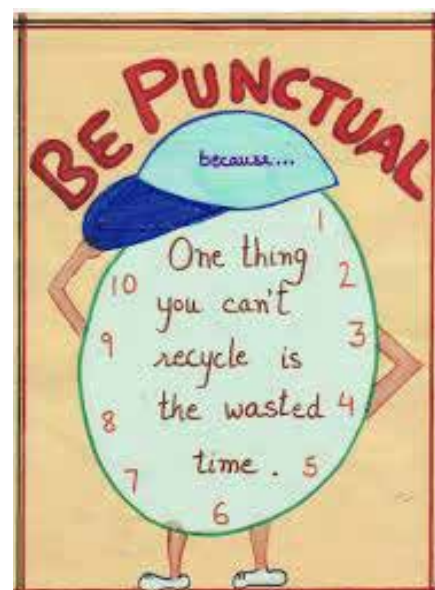
Lunch - please remember to pre book and pay on parentpay - we cannot provide lunches that havent been booked and paid for.
