Objectives of spending PE & Sport Premium Funding
<p>Our key objective in using the PE & Sport Premium Grant was to use the funding to introduce new sports and activities that encourage more pupils to take up sport as well as support and invite the least active children by running additional sporting activities.</p> <p>We have used existing research and publications including those from the OfSTED Good Practice series and finding of studies undertaken by various sporting bodies to enable us to make decisions relating to provision.</p> <p>We have invested in using the skills of qualified sports coaches and providing high quality resources and equipment to ensuring that the success of our PE & Sport programmes are good.</p>

<p>This academic Year, Lace Hill academy used the sports premium grant to help fund the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• External coaches provided lunchtime clubs for children across the school. 3 sessions run each day: Years 1&2, Years 3&4, Years 5&6• Pupils attended Primary Sports leader conference to develop playground leader programme• More children active during break and lunch times due to more structured activities being offered• PE golden certificate given out in whole school assembly to one child in KS1 and one child in KS2 per week• School Sports coordinator employed to develop and coordinate PE and Sport across the school• Raised profile of sport across the school e.g. certificates in assembly, school sports noticeboard, newsletter articles, sports awards• All children to take part in class competitions at the end of a unit of work in PE• Bikeability offered to children in Reception and Year 3• S1 partake in an hour of additional dance delivered by a specialist dance coach for half of the academic year• Entry to sports festivals through Buckingham School Sports Partnership• School Sports coordinator employed to organise and take pupils to festivals• In 18/19 pupils enter ed17 sporting activities including a change 4 life festival to target the less active children• Entry to sports competitions through Buckingham School Sports Partnership• School Sports coordinator employed to organise and take pupils to festivals• Use of lunchtime clubs to practise for festivals• Minibus hire to travel to competitions• Pupils had increased practice time/opportunities and greater knowledge of sports rules.
