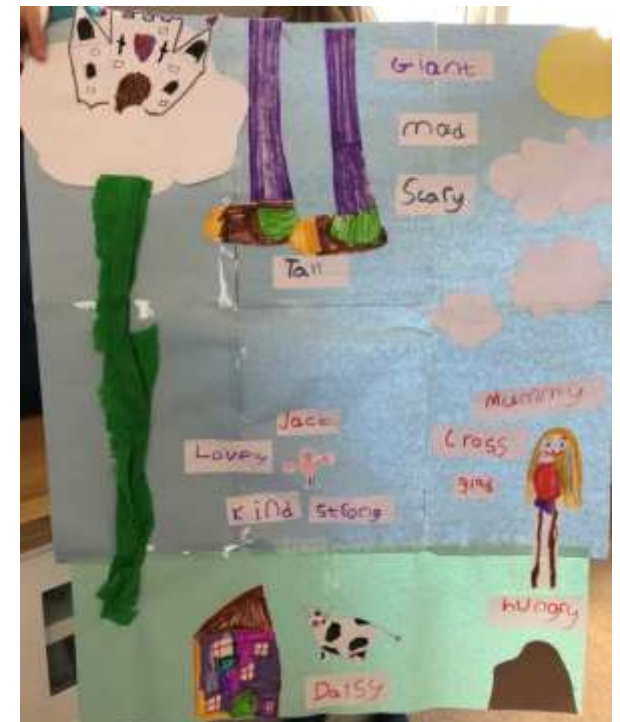


Here are some of your amazing pieces of Jack and the Beanstalk artwork you have created at home.

Dear parents, carers and children in Reception,

Such good news this week; we can all be back in school the week after next! I am super excited about seeing all your lovely smiley faces back in school again on Monday 8th March. It will be great for you all to meet your friends again and for us all to share our exciting learning together in school once more.

Our new topic story this week is Jack and the Beanstalk. We started the week by listening to the story and adding actions to help us to remember what happened. We should all know the story really well by now. We have also been talking about the setting and the characters in the story. I have loved seeing all your amazing creative artwork on Seesaw, there were some very tall beanstalks, some very mean looking giants and lots of golden eggs!

On Thursday, we drew a story map to show the beginning, middle and end of the story, and today we are going to be adding words and captions to the map. In maths we have been adding two amounts of fruit and vegetables along with different coloured 'magic' beans; we have been using the 'part, part, whole' method to help us. We have also been grouping and sharing magic beans and golden eggs.

Poor Jack had no food to eat. When he looked in his cupboard all that was on the shelf was a rotten apple core, a mouldy piece of cheese and a pair of smelly socks! We have been learning about which food types we need to eat to have a balanced diet. We will continue to learn how to eat healthily over the next few weeks.

Next week, we will be starting to write our story in literacy. By Friday, we will have written the beginning and the middle of the story. At the end of the story Jack had lots of golden eggs. He was a very kind boy, so he decided to give some of his eggs away to his friends. In maths we will be learning how to subtract, take-away.

It is officially 'World Book Day' on Thursday 4th March. Lace Hill Academy would like to celebrate this really special day when all the children are back in school, so we will be celebrating 'World Book Day' on Friday 12th March. You can start thinking now about which one of your favourite books you would like to bring into school, and which costume you would like to wear.
