Hi Everyone,

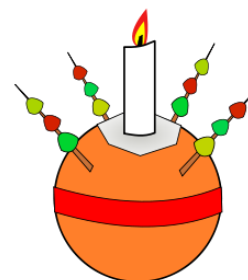
