



Annual PE Report – 2017 /2018

Holy Cross Catholic Primary School

Building on our successes in 2016 / 2017 we will be focusing on continuing to provide a broad and balanced curriculum supplemented by a high quality offer of lunch time and after-school clubs with further provision in the form of representative teams. This year we will be utilising the Primary PE Passport (an online curriculum and assessment tool) to provide a more comprehensive overview of standards within PE and school sport.

Curriculum

The school's curriculum will be delivered by teachers supported by sports coaches from Plymouth Argyle Football Club, Plymouth Albion Rugby Club, The Plymouth School Sports Partnership and Premier Sports. The PE subject leader will observe a number of lessons across the year and lead staff meetings where staff will observe video evidence for purposes of moderation and to deepen teachers' skills in delivering high quality PE feedback.

EYFS

Children in EYFS will be working through Development Matters, the Early Years framework. In the Prime Area of Physical Development we aspire for XXX % of children at our school achieve the Early Learning Goal – Moving and Handling and XXX% to have achieved the Learning Goal – Health and Self – Care.

KS1

In KS1 the children are taught the Fundamental Movement Skills; Multi skills, gymnastics, dance and athletics. They will also learn how to attack and defend as the basis for invasion games. The children will be formatively assessed in 3 areas for each unit of work: acquiring skills; thinking skills and applying skills. Using these 3 criteria the children will then be assessed as working at either a Bronze, Silver or Gold standard.

KS2

In KS2 the children will study outdoor and adventurous activities; dance; gymnastics, swimming (Year 3 only); athletics, Invasion games, Target games, net/wall games and strike and field games. The children will be formatively assessed in 3 areas for each unit of work: acquiring skills; thinking skills and applying skills. Using these 3 criteria the children will then be assessed as working at either a Bronze, Silver or Gold standard.

In future years we will be able to track progress of cohorts and will also use this data to lead staff training on differentiated learning as well as opportunities for children who need additional support to reach ARE and for children who are more able.

Participation

Thanks to the generosity of the staff and through collaboration with our club providers; Plymouth Argyle, PremierSport.org and South West Martial Arts, the school will deliver a comprehensive range of clubs in 2017/2018. We aim to cater for all age groups as we will be providing; football, hockey, basketball, multi skills, Kwik Cricket, athletics, martial arts, Archery amongst others.

We aspire to have 100% of children having taking part in an extra-curricular club (lunch or after school) by the end of the year.

Competition

Intra School

Holy Cross Primary School will provide opportunities in KS1 and KS2 for children to participate in intra school events in a range of sports including Hockey, Tag Rugby and Athletics amongst many others. These events will provide valuable opportunities or children to gain experience playing competitive sport with their peers; it will give some the confidence to transfer this competence into competing against other schools.

The school will run a number of competitive teams during the course of the academic year. Overall we aspire for at least 75% of KS2 children to represent their school in an inter school sports fixture. Altogether the school will take part in 17 fixtures / tournaments across the year. Teams will represent the school in such events as; KS1 Multi Skills Festival, Chage4Life Festival, Mini Rd Tennis, Primary Athletics, Indoor Rowing and Go Ride.

Links with sports clubs

The school will benefit from links with the following local sports clubs in terms of them supporting our work in curriculum time and our extra-curricular programme.

- South West Martial Arts

Furthermore we have signposted children to the clubs listed for them to develop in the community.

2017 / 2018 – Objectives

- To assess the quality of the planning and teaching of PE across the school.
- Ensure that assessment judgements are secure.
- To monitor and assess the level of engagement and skill demonstrated by pupil premium children across the school, providing additional support if required.
- Assess the quality and availability of PE equipment.
- Continue to develop the partnership school status with Plymouth University based on the provision of PE.
- Retain a School Games mark to a gold standard.
- More PE opportunities are being offered to children – both through the PSSP and after school club provider.
- Promote a series of School teams across a variety of sports.
- Children are rewarded for their achievements in PE and these are celebrated with equal importance as the main academic achievements.
- Raising the profile of PE through different subjects.
