Reading

The children have been very engaged during story time and sharing books is an essential part of developing communication and language skills. Through stories children can express their own thoughts and emotions, learn new, exciting words and build the foundations for language development.

Over the next few weeks the children will be given their own book bag to take between home and nursery. Your child can use this to choose a new book each time they are at Nursery.

How you can help

At home: Make sure that all of your child's belongings are named. Encourage them to put on their shoes and coat by themselves. Establish a calm bedtime routine which allows for enough sleep.

Look out for: Autumn events such as Killerton Apple Weekend 13th & 14th October

Listen to: All the exciting things your child has been doing at Nursery.

Visit: Outdoor places like gardens, parks and woodlands to look for signs of autumn.
