

# Year 2 Learning Letter

## This Half Term's Project

### Down in Devon!

This term we are learning about the wonderful county of Devon. To introduce the topic the children have taken part in a traditional Devon cream tea. In geography they will be developing their mapping skills by locating key places on a map such as Exeter, Exmouth and Dartmoor. The children will then go on to study the life of Isambard Brunel and look at some of his greatest engineering achievements including Bristol suspension bridge. In art we will be exploring the work of Betty Bettesworth who creates simple designs of Devon travel posters.

**Knowledge Organiser** You will find attached to this document what we are calling a 'Knowledge Organiser'. This captures the knowledge and vocabulary we are focusing upon in an area of the curriculum. Please take some time to look this through so that you can help your child to remember the things they are learning in science.

## Mathematics

This term we will be focusing on addition and subtraction of 2-digit numbers using a variety of strategies, which include counting on and back on a blank number line and partitioning. We will continue to develop our place value skills through problem solving and money. The children will develop their multiplication and division skills through grouping and sharing. They will be using both practical activities and mental strategies to help them find half, quarter and a third of a number.

## English

Our first English unit this term is centred around a story called 'The Boy Who Cried Ninja'. This humorous text is an adaptation of The Boy Who Cried Wolf. We will be revising punctuation with a focus on question marks and developing the use of conjunctions and/while. We will then move on to exploring seaside themed poetry. Each of these units will provide opportunities for the children to develop their language skills through learning new and exciting vocabulary.

## Year 2 Summer Home Learning

**ESSENTIAL** each week:

### Reading

Make a time to read regularly. Little and often is best. When sharing a book with your child make sure to spend time talking about what has been read. This will help the children to develop their comprehension skills.

### Maths

x3 sessions of up to 15 minutes practise of the current maths skills on Education City. New homework tasks will be updated fortnightly.

*Lost your Education City log-in? Ask your class teacher to provide you with this again.*

*Did you know that you can print off certificates from Education City?*

### OPTIONAL to enjoy over the

**Summer Term** to further support your child's learning and skills. How much time to spend on each task will depend on the activity. A good rule to go by is... enough time to enjoy but not too much time to make learning a chore.

**Research:** What do you know about Isambard Brunel? What was he famous for? What facts can you find out?

**Go:** Visit Exeter Cathedral or go for a walk on Dartmoor or Exmoor National Park.

**Draw or make:** Create a scrap book of places you have visited and plants and flowers you have found.
