Every Minute Counts

Child A reads **1 minute a day** = 180 minutes in a school year = **8,000 words**

Child B reads **5 minutes a day** = 900 minutes in a school year = **282,000 words**

Child C reads **20 minutes a day** = 3,600 minutes in a school year = **1,800,000 words**
