

Primary PE and Sport Premium Funding 2020/2021

Brampton Village Primary School

Current numbers on roll (nor) Reception – Y6 = **532**

Number of children in Reception and years 1 – 6 who are **eligible** for Sport Premium on the January 2020 School Census = **484**

The amount of funding we are receiving for the 2020/2021 academic year is £20,000. This amount has been boosted by an amount of £4,000 brought forward from 2019-2020 due to unspent money as a result of the school closing in March 2020 as a result of coronavirus. Consequently the amount of planned expenditure incurred during the year is in excess of the grant we will receive.

Background:

The Government have provided funding for Physical Education (PE) and sport to schools. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision. The funding is for the period 1 September 2019 – 31 August 2020. This funding is ring fenced to be used for sport specific areas to make a sustainable impact in Physical Education and Sport in schools.

Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and Sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels of which they are capable.

The vision for the Primary PE and Sport Premium is:

All pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

OBJECTIVE: To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools.

Key Indicators We Are Aiming to See Improvement Against

1. *The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity is increased.*
2. *The profile of PE and Sport across the school is raised.*
3. *Increase skills, knowledge and confidence of staff in teaching PE in sport.*
4. *Broaden the experience of all pupils through a range of sports and activities.*
5. *Increased participation in competitive sport.*
6. *Meeting national curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety.*

During the academic year September 2020 to July 2021 we plan to spend our funding in the areas listed below:
