Sustainability:

High quality CPD for class teachers will improve quality of teaching, building on progression of skills over time and continuing into the future
Sports crew modelling playground activities will enable children to self-initiate own active play over time and train future sports leaders
Forest school training will enable the continuation of improved forest school sessions, with the potential for updating to L3 qualification to facilitate in-house teaching in the future to engage children in outdoor learning.
