Sports Premium Funding 2013-2014

The Government has given each primary school a package of funding for physical education (PE) and school sport. This is a lump sum of £8,000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil that is ring-fenced for the purpose of improving sports and PE opportunities for all pupils.

At Albourne CE School we are using the Sports Premium for a range of provision. We have joined Mid Sussex Active (Locality Sports partnership). We will have access to competitions, further training and other locality sporting events. Some of the funding has been used to train our own Year 6 play leaders, who have taken part in setting up a Change4Life multi-skills club.

We have also used the funding to develop the expertise of our staff through training. On the table below, which shows Ofsted Guidance of examples of effective use of PE and sport funding, we have shown how we have used the grant already and some of the other initiatives we have planned. We will update this page to show the impact of these in the future.
