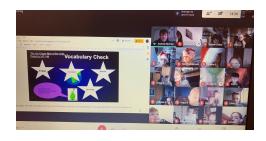
We will see you Monday morning and later on in the newsletter, you will be able to see opportunities for Christmas festivities and LIVE moments to share in, on Facebook and Dojo.
