This year, the Summer Reading Challenge will be different - we are going digital!

Meet the Silly Squad, an adventurous team of animals who love to get stuck in to all different kinds of funny books!

The challenge is live now from June to September.

How to take part

Children sign up at Silly Squad and create their own profile with the assistance of an adult. They set their own reading goals, and are encouraged to read anything that makes them happy – fiction, information books, comics, jokes. Children are encouraged to read library books, digital eBooks and listen to eAudio books or read books they already have at home. Rewards and Incentives

Children are rewarded with fun activities and incentives along the way, such as online badges, games and videos. When they complete the challenge, they receive a downloadable certificate.

Children who take part maintain reading confidence levels over the summer and are more enthusiastic about books and reading.



It keeps children actively reading over the summer, supporting the transition between year groups and stages.
