Dear Parents.



Although it seems like such a long time ago, I would like to announce a huge thank you to everyone who was involved in the Christmas PTA events. The PTA are looking forward to paying for playground markings, so please look out as these will hopefully be appearing before the summer!

There has been a lot in the news in recent months about the need for schools to support children's emotional well-being, as well as their academic achievement. We recognise that a number of children, at certain times and for a variety of reasons, can struggle with their feelings or friendships, and that this can impact on their focus and ability to learn.



As a school we are starting to explore the "Thrive Approach", which focuses on supporting children's social and emotional skills.

Ms Pauline Adams (our SENCo) is currently undertaking a 10-day Thrive Practitioner training course throughout this academic year, and we will be looking at how we can introduce this approach in different ways across the school and for individual pupils.

Part of the "Thrive Approach" includes an online assessment tool which can be carried out with staff to find strategies to support individuals or groups of children. Ms Adams will be speaking to Class Teachers to consider groups or individual children across the school who may benefit, and so we may in due course be contacting individual parents to discuss this further. (We will not be assessing or working with individual children without parental permission.)

Mrs Lisa Gardner (one of our HLTAs) will also soon be starting a 5-day Emotional Literacy (ELSA) course, and is attending regular Learning Mentor network meetings. In due course we will also be looking at how we can use these ideas within school.

If you have any questions about this, please do not hesitate to speak to Ms Adams – she is not in school every day but you can contact her via the school office to make an appointment.
