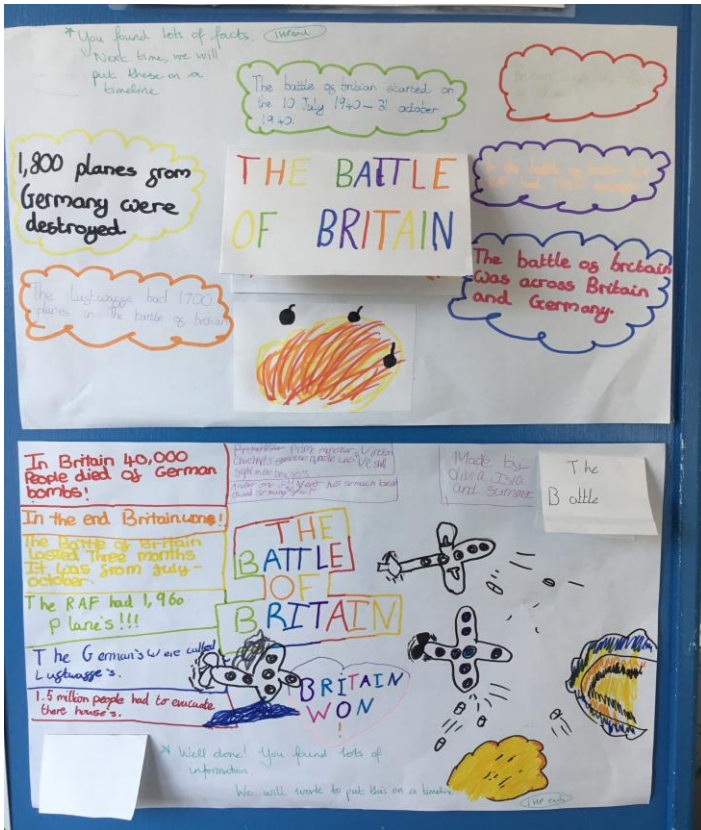


Badgers are exploring mini beasts.

Otters and Hedgehogs are creating and describing fantasy settings in English.

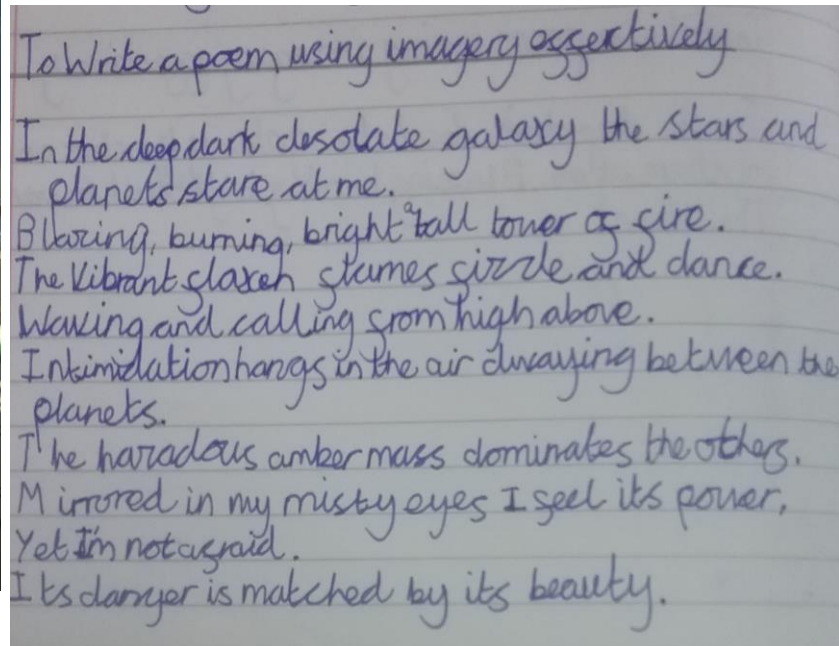


Key Stage 2
