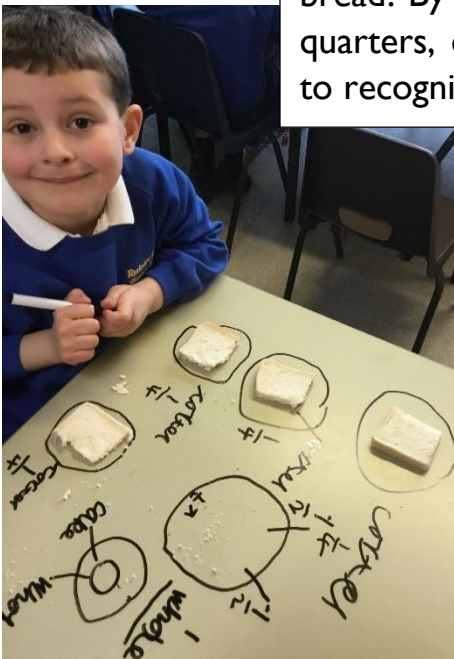

We look forward to welcoming you for Parents' Evening next week. Please note that this will be in the **school hall**. We are holding both sessions in the hall this time to ensure staff are together and everyone is in one place. There will be seats in the middle of the room for you to sit on and look through your child's work, which will be laid out for you. I have reminded the teachers that appointments are 10 minutes per child and that we all need to stick to time as best as possible to be fair to everyone. Should you have any issues that you feel will take longer you are always welcome to book a separate, mutually convenient appointment with your child's teacher.

Mrs Willcocks and I have been tidying the offices at school and have come across the school Log Books which the Headteacher has kept since March 1903. Mrs Ramm was at pains to ensure I carried this on, which I am pleased to report I have! These Log Books are written in the most beautiful copperplate script back in the 1900's and 1910's. They contain endless information about school life on at least a weekly basis. This year will see the centenary of the end of the First World War. To mark this occasion I will type up some of the entries from Mr J. H. Evans who was the Headmaster at Radnage until 1922. Reading the Headmaster's entries shows that little has changed and attendance was a big deal in 1918...

From the Log Books

4th March 1918

Reopened the school after closure due to mumps. Four children are reported as fresh cases and I have notified them according to rule.

8th March 1918

Average for the week 44, 81% there are 13 absentees this (Friday) afternoon.

15th March 1918

Average for the week 42.6, 78.8% there are no less than 17 absentees this (Friday) afternoon. A few children are away through illness but this in no way accounts for the poor attendance today nor for the miserably low percentage for the week.

You Said... We have...

Our governing body are keen to respond to the Parent Survey that was conducted in the summer term last year. Within the next few newsletters I have been asked to report back on actions that have been addressed since September.

You said... Children need free lunches in key stage 1.

We have... Back in October we starting using The Kids Packed Lunch Company to provide a free infant packed lunch for all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2.
