Dear Parents,

This week we would like to make phonics our priority. It is our aim that the children know all of the set 1 and 2 sounds and can read and spell words containing these sounds when they reach year 1.

I know that you have been working on letter recognition using the cards sent home. Last week you were asked to search Phonics with Rosie on youtube and do Set 2 lessons https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCo7fbLgY2oA_cFCI9GdxtQ

This week the sounds are ou, oy, ay, ee, igh.

There are 2 videos for each day which stay up for 24 hours only. Please watch the Set 2 **Speed Sound** video first, then the Set 2 **Spelling**. After a break, please help your child to write the sentences which incorporate the focus sound of the day. Don't worry if your child needs more practice as the whole set 2 sequence is on a loop and repeats every 2 weeks.

Tuesday	oy	The boy has a toy.	I enjoy my toys.
Wednesday	ay	You can play with clay.	Go away she says.
Thursday	ee	The bee stung my feet.	Sh! The queen is asleep.
Friday	igh	It is not light at night.	The sun is bright today.



For reading, please use Oxford Owl online ebooks, searching for Read Write inc.
