#### SCHOOL GATEWAY App and online account

Have you logged in to your School Comms Gateway account yet? It saves you time and school money to pay online. There is also an app available to download for quick payments, receiving messages and also to report absence.

If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact the school.

#### **INVOICES**

Invoices were sent out for After School Clubs at the end of the Summer Term. Full payment is now overdue. If you need clarification, ask Mrs Tompkins in the school office. Clubs letter for Autumn Term 2018 has been sent out. To apply for a place, please return the after school club request form. Thank you.

#### School Dinners – Autumn Term 2018

Please note that the cost of school dinners is £2.40 daily for Nursery and Oak Class. If, however you wish to pay for school dinners half termly or termly please see below: Half term = £93.60 Full Term = £175.20

This can be paid via the School Gateway. Your account will show that it is in credit, this will reduce when your child takes a school meal.

#### Milk – Autumn Term 2018

Milk can be ordered for Autumn Term 2018. This is open to pupils in Reception to Year2 at a cost of £18.25. For all nursery children it is free. (For more information please ask the school office staff).

**Cooler Weather:** As the weather is turning cooler, please ensure you child/children bring a suitable coat. Please make sure your child/children bring a tracksuit for PE. This is to be Black or Navy Blue. No logos please.

**Sand Play:** Please can you have a rummage in garden sheds/garages for any unwanted buckets and spades. The children will make great use of these in the sandpit. Thank you

**Nuts:** Please make sure your children do not bring food containing nuts into school.

#### Absence Procedure – a reminder!

For **planned** absence, please complete a Leave of Absence form (available from the office). This should be returned to school no less than 2 weeks before the planned absence.

For **unplanned absence** (illness etc.), please ensure you have <u>called the school office by 9.30am to let us know</u>. You should call the school office on each day that your child is absent, unless asked otherwise. Please do not assume that we know where your child is. <u>This should always be followed by a written explanation on their return. You can also use the School Gateway App to provide an explanation. If medical evidence is available, please also provide this. For children with attendance below 95%, our policy is to have written confirmation in order to authorize.</u>

### Whole School Attendance this year: 95.5%

This is a HUGE improvement on last year (94.2%) and the best attendance rate Hormead School has had for over 5 years! It means more children have an attendance rate above the expected rate than below it. Thank you for your support!!
