## Class news

In Sapphire class this half term we have done lots of exciting learning! Our topic was: What's that sound? We explored many different ways to make and change sounds. We finished our set 1 sounds in RWI. We enjoyed our Talk for Writing story: Peace at Last. We also learned about 3D shapes which was very interesting!



## Amber Class has been very busy this term!

Our first topic was Superheroes. We had such fun learning about all the different heroes, both real and fictitious. We dressed up as our favourite Superhero and wrote about our chosen hero. We discussed the different powers superheroes have and what powers we would like if we were a superhero. We learnt about two very important real life heroines - Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole. We investigated what they did to make them heroines and why we still remember them today.

Our second topic was Dinosaurs. We have learnt lots about different dinosaurs, including what features they have and what foods they ate - were they herbivores, omnivores or carnivores? We learnt about a very important person called Mary Anning who discovered fossils. Through our research on Mary Anning we have learnt a lot about fossils and we had fun creating our own fossils using clay! We are looking forward to learning about the Great Fire of London in our next topic!

## Year 2- Onyx and Jade Classes

Our topic for this term was BOUNCE. To immerse our children in the topic we spent a lovely afternoon engaging in gymnastic activities during which they learnt how agile and flexible their bodies are. In addition to this, in Science, they learnt the importance of eating a healthy diet and how it affects their daily lives. This led to them writing brilliant recounts of their own version of the 'The Frog Prince.' We look forward to more exciting learning next term.





#### Year 4

We have been learning about the Romans this half term in their topic, 'I Am Warrior!' We visited Chertsey Museum, where we all enjoyed learning about the Romans and creating clay pots, tablets as well as going on a hunt around the museum for artefacts! We enjoyed making shields which we designed in Art and then made during DT. We took these outside and marched like real Roman soldiers in a legion!

#### Year 5

What do you know about Anne Boleyn? Year 5 have been finding out all about her early life, her marriage, her aspirations, her downfall and her subsequent death in our topic, 'Off With Her Head!' First, we found out about the Tudor family tree and the dominance of Henry VIII by writing his biography, including the way he treated his six wives. He wrote a famous song called Greensleeves for Anne Boleyn which we enjoyed singing. We know what happened to his six wives and why, who Henry VIII really loved, who survived after his death and who his children were.

Henry VIII was keen to punish anyone who disagreed with him, so we found out about the harsh Tudor punishments and decided we did not want to displease the King! As part of our fact-finding mission, we had an interesting visit from Chertsey Museum, looking at Tudor artefacts and trying our hand at writing with a quill. We wrote a public notice to announce the death of Anne Boleyn; did you know that Henry VIII was playing tennis while she was being beheaded in the Tower of London? We examined the letter that Anne Boleyn wrote Henry on the eve of her death and then we wrote our own using emotive language, trying to persuade Henry VIII to accept our innocence and send the swordsman back to France! Find out from Year 5 if we succeeded!

### **From our Academy Business Manager, Mr Jeremy Kite:**

Our Auditors have once again given our MAT a clean audit report – which means that our accounts provide a true and fair view of our financial affairs. We have submitted our accounts to the ESFA ahead of the 31 December deadline and our company secretary will submit these to Companies House on our behalf. In January our auditors will submit the Annual Accounts Return on our behalf before 19 January 2018.

Our current building projects are nearing completion at both schools with roofing and fire safety projects likely to finish by the end of January. These works have been funded by the ESFA from whom we successfully bid for funds of nearly £900k. This year we have made further bids for works totalling around £300k relating to electrical safety at both schools, a new kitchen at New Monument and security fencing at Broadmere. We will learn if we have been successful in March.

## Sports news!

On Friday the 6th of October we had a professional athlete, Ezekiel Ewulo, visit from Sports for Champions. He spent time with each class completing a circuit. All children thoroughly enjoyed this. Ezekiel then spoke to us all about his training, diet and dedication to his much loved sport, long jump. We raised over **£400.00** to help support the charity Sports for Champions. Well done to everyone who took part.

Our KS 2 pupils have been very busy this term. In October we had 2 teams compete in football tournaments. The year 5 and 6 boys team and the year 5 and 6 girls team did not win any matches but a great time was had by all who participated.
