Dear Parents and Carers

This morning we have received confirmation that a member of staff in the Nursery has tested positive for Covid-19.

We have been in discussions with Public Health England throughout the morning and have now had confirmation that, in line with their guidance, **all children in the Nursery cannot be in school and now need to self-isolate for the next 12 days** as the last point of contact was on Tuesday 17th November. This is a precautionary measure in order to reduce the possible spread of the virus to family, friends and the wider community. Children will be able to **return to school on Wednesday 2nd December** at the normal time.

Please note that **siblings** of Nursery children **should still attend school as normal**, unless you are told to self-isolate by the NHS Test and Trace team; or in the event that the Nursery child or anyone else in your household develops symptoms.

If your child, or anyone in your household, starts to develop any of the symptoms associated with Covid-19 (a reminder of these is set out below), please follow government advice and seek a test. Please also let us know the outcome of your test once known so that we can follow up with Public Health England as appropriate.

We continue to maintain the rigorous arrangements that we have in place across the site to keep bubbles separate from each other, with our enhanced cleaning and hygiene regimes firmly in place. Our school risk assessment is available for you to view on our website.

We are providing the person concerned with as much support as we can, and our whole school community sends its best wishes to them and to their family.

As a reminder, we have summarised the Government guidance regarding Coronavirus symptoms and ways in which to reduce the transmission below.

Symptoms of COVID19

The most important symptoms of coronavirus (COVID19) are recent onset of any of the following:

- a new continuous cough
- a high temperature
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell

For most people, coronavirus (COVID19) will be a mild illness. However, if you have any of the symptoms above you must stay at home and arrange to have a test to see if you have

How to stop COVID19 spreading

These are the most important things you can do to protect yourself and others from coronavirus:

Do:

- follow the government's rules on social distancing
- wash your hands with soap and water often – do this for at least 20 seconds
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- wash your hands as soon as you get home
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards

Don't

- do not touch your eyes, nose or mouth if your hands are not clean

Face coverings

If you can, wear something that covers your nose and mouth in places where it's hard to stay away from other people.

There are some places where you must wear a face covering, such as:

- on public transport
- in shops
- when you go to hospital appointments or visit someone in hospital

Important: Some people should not wear face coverings, such as children under 3 and people with breathing difficulties.
