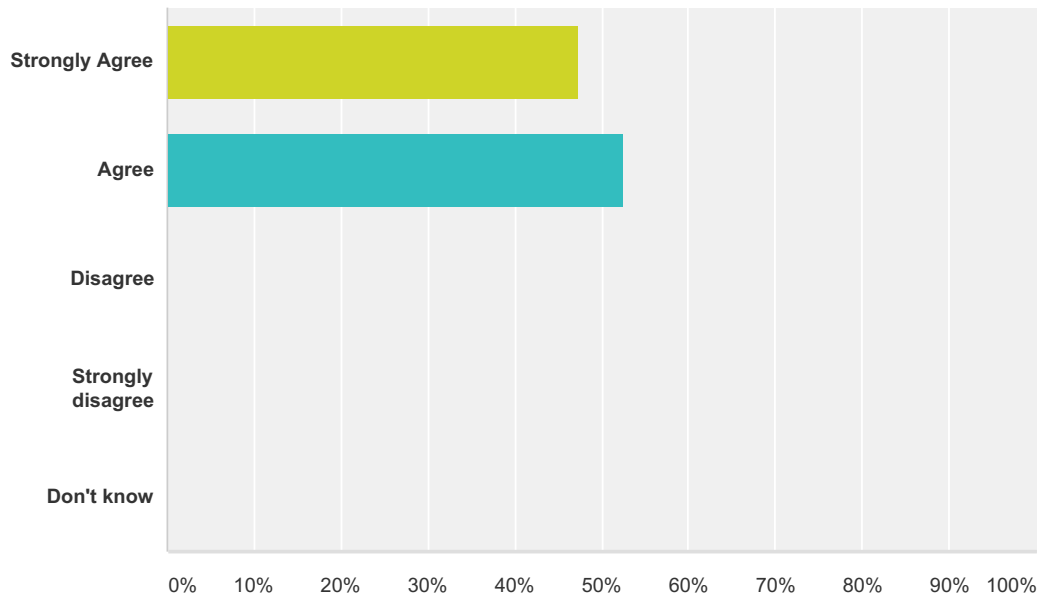

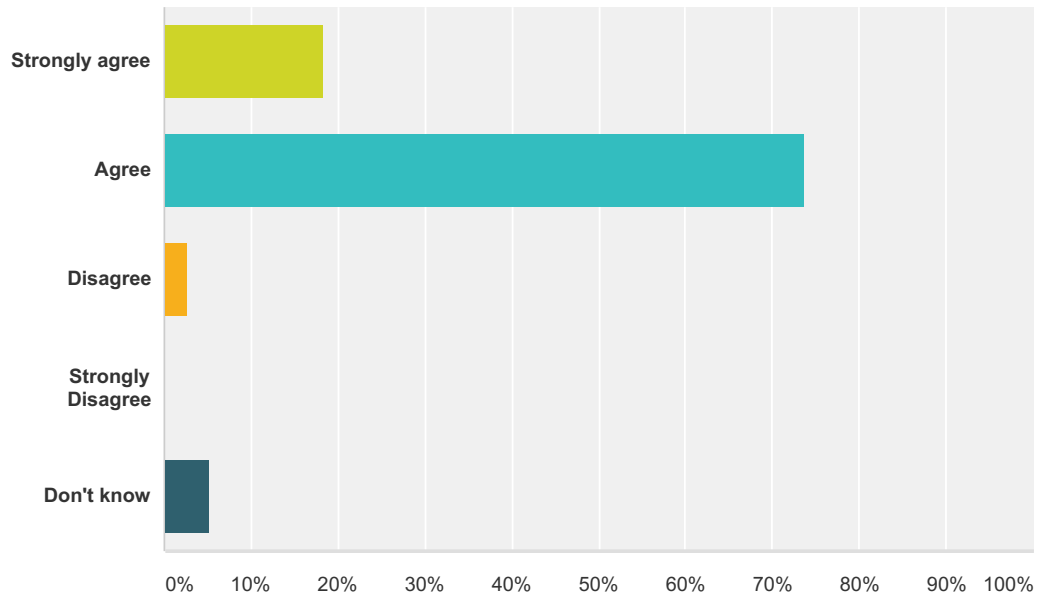

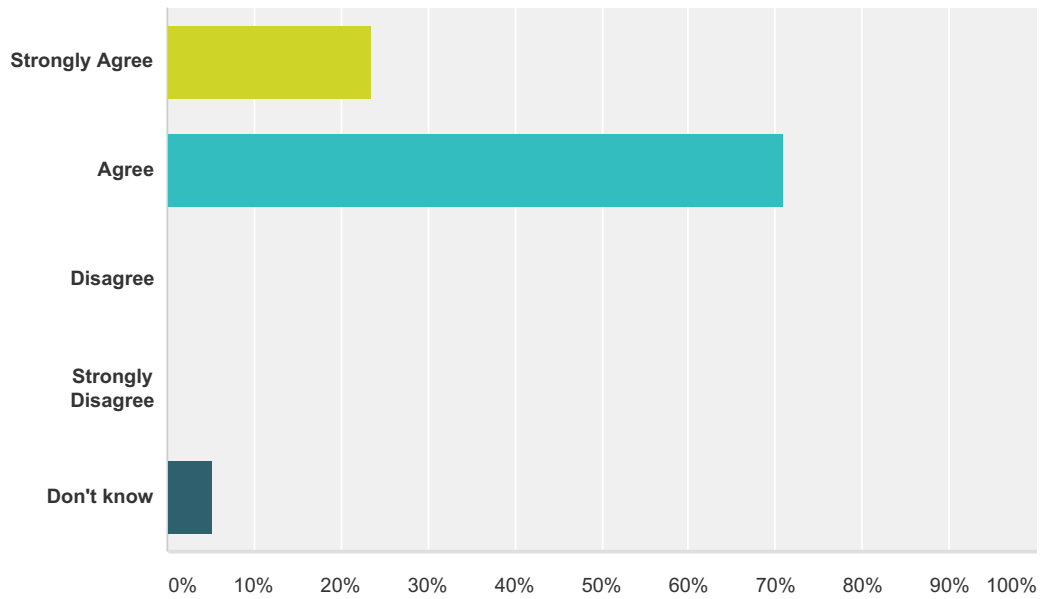

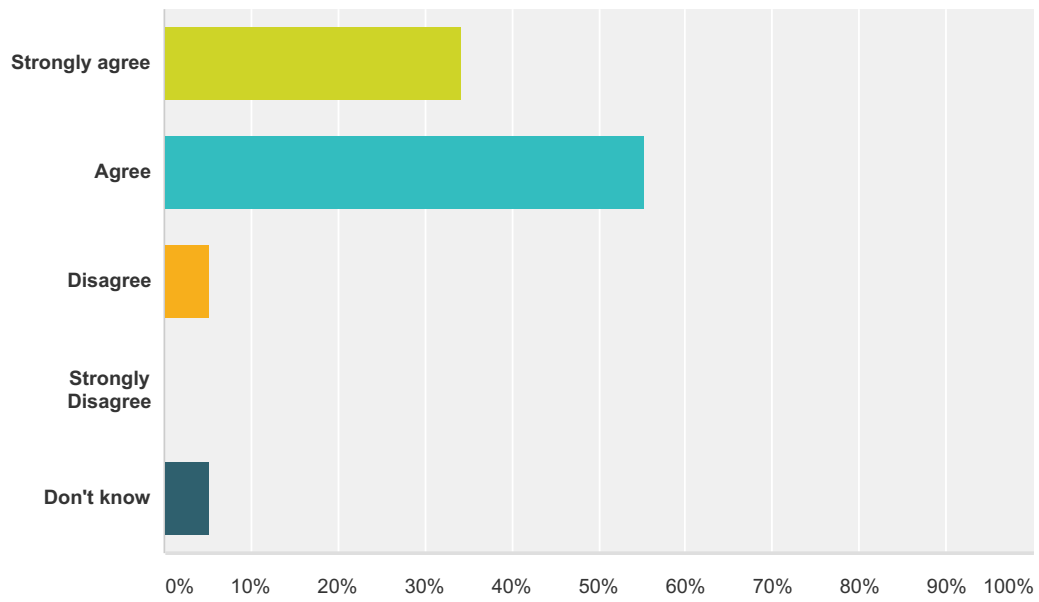

### Q5 My child is encouraged to work hard and try their best

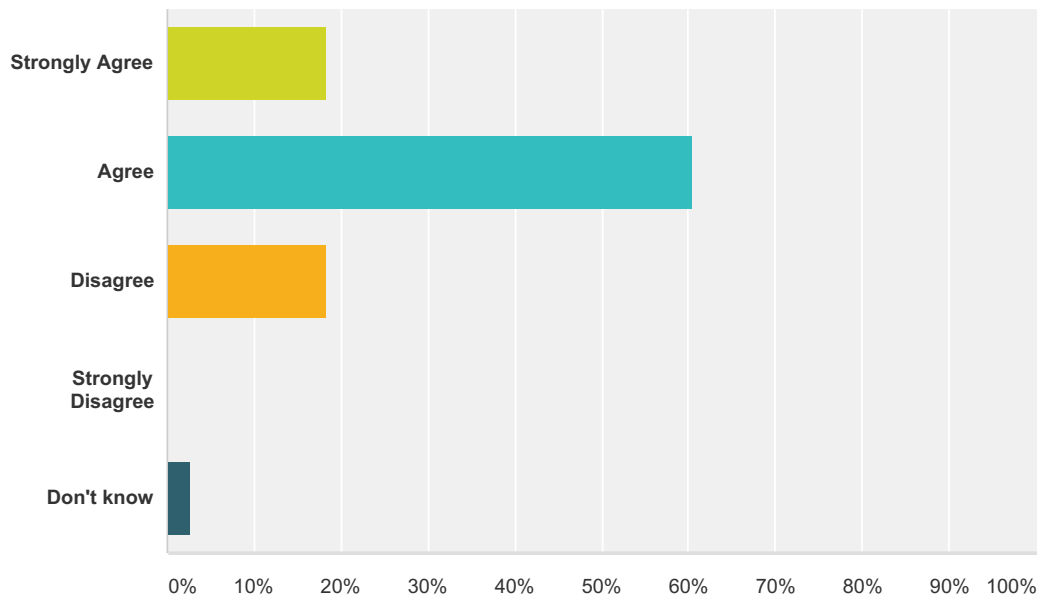

### Q6 The school communicates with parents effectively

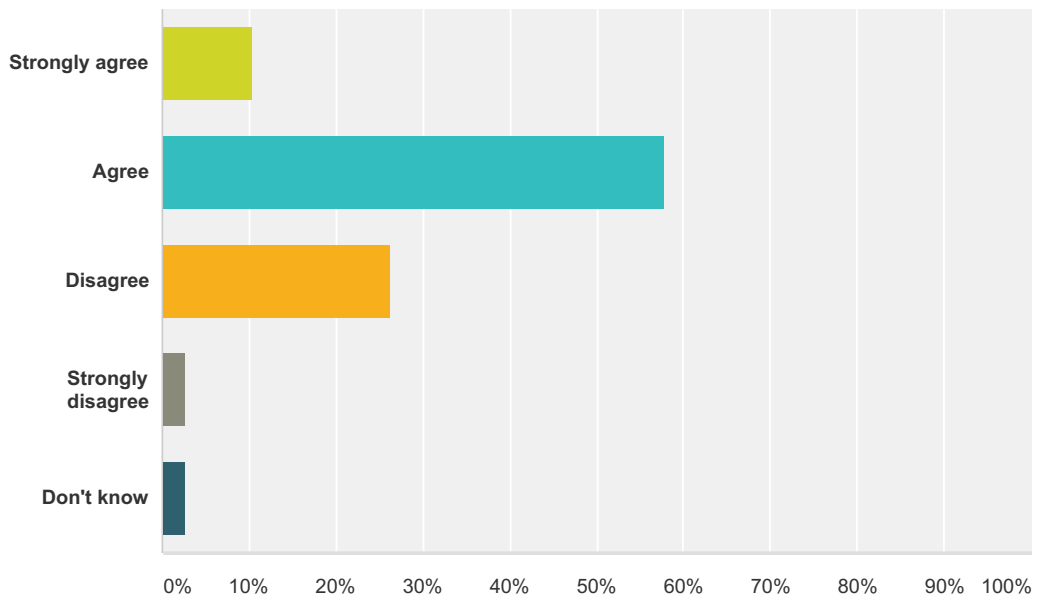

### Q7 The school provides good feedback about my child's progress.

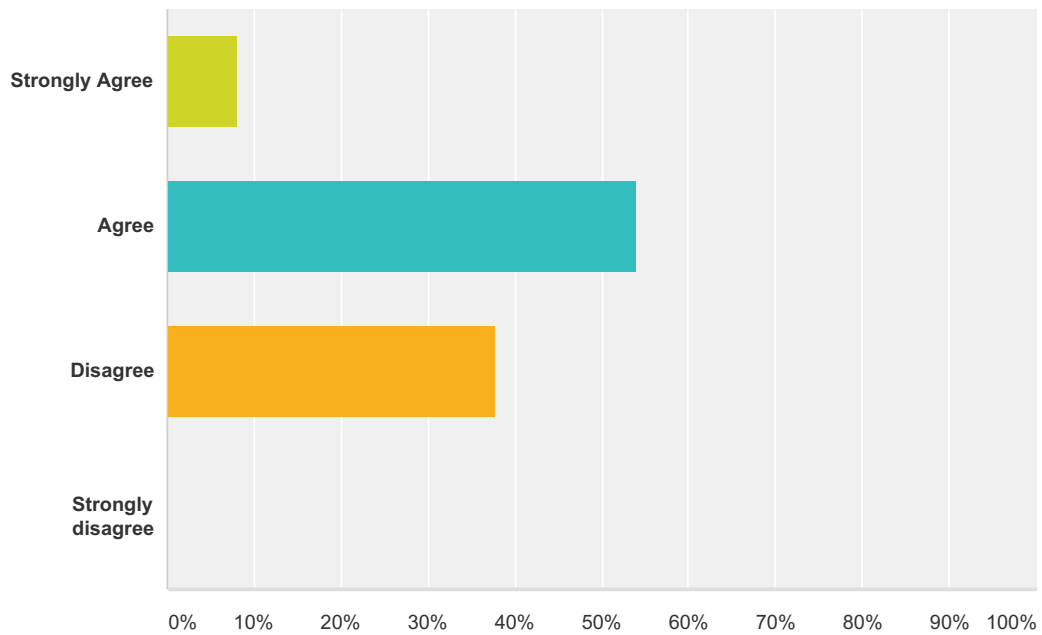

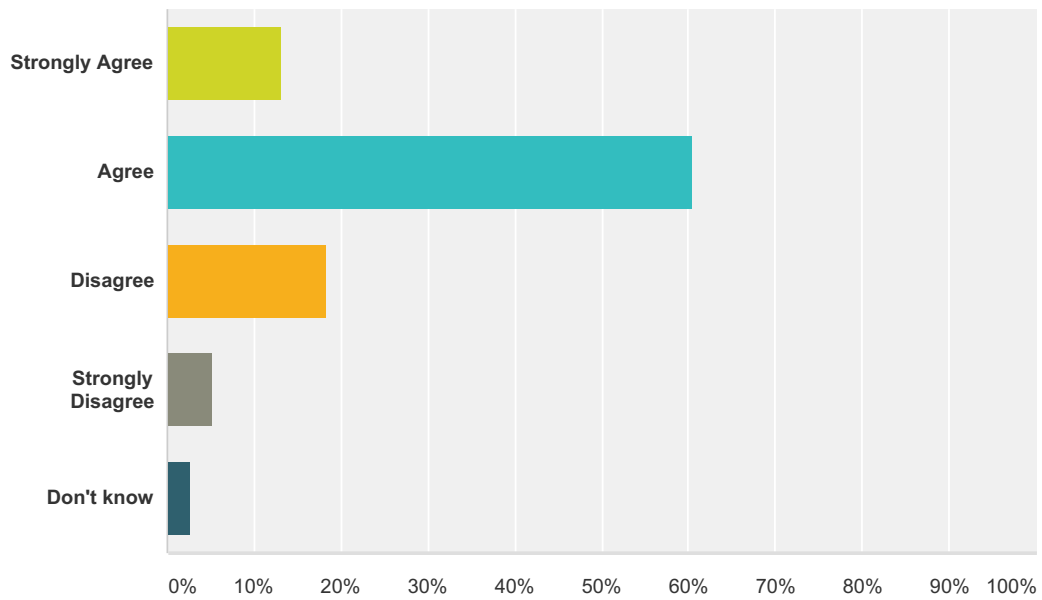

### Q9 My child receives an appropriate amount of homework for his/her age.

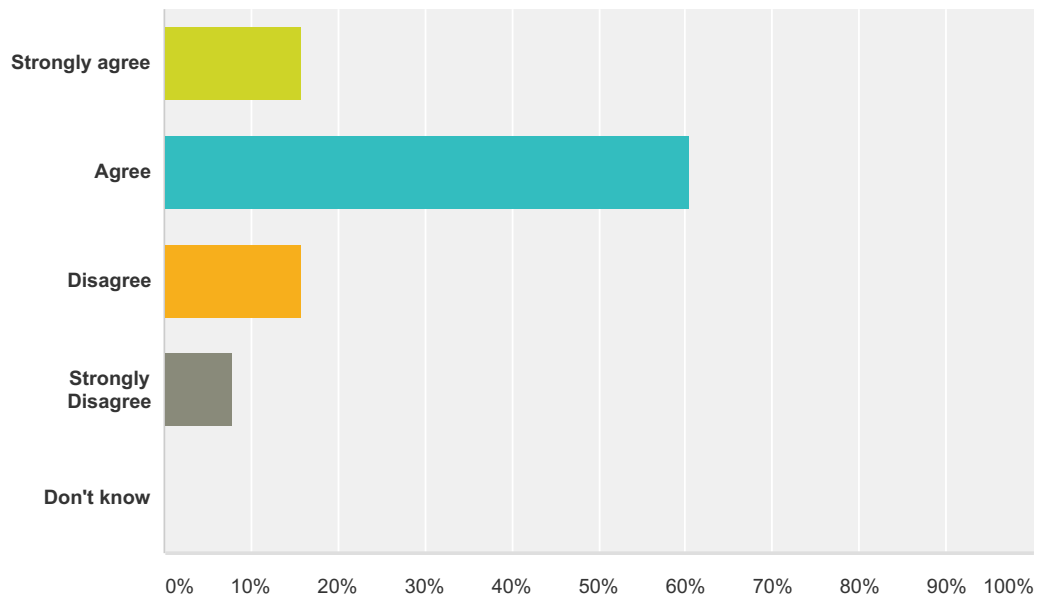

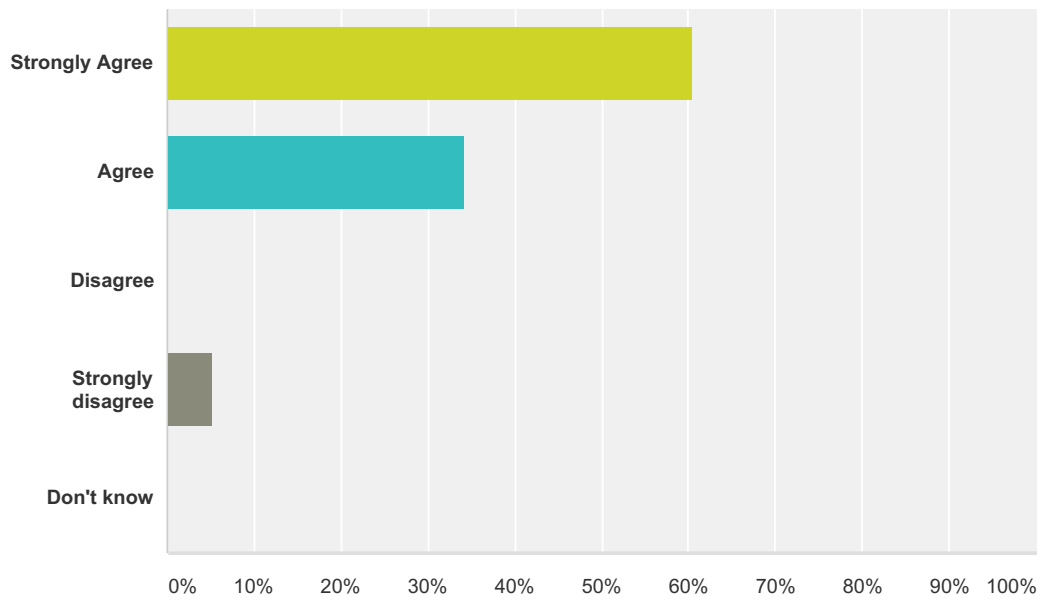

### Q11 There are good standards of behaviour at Frieth School

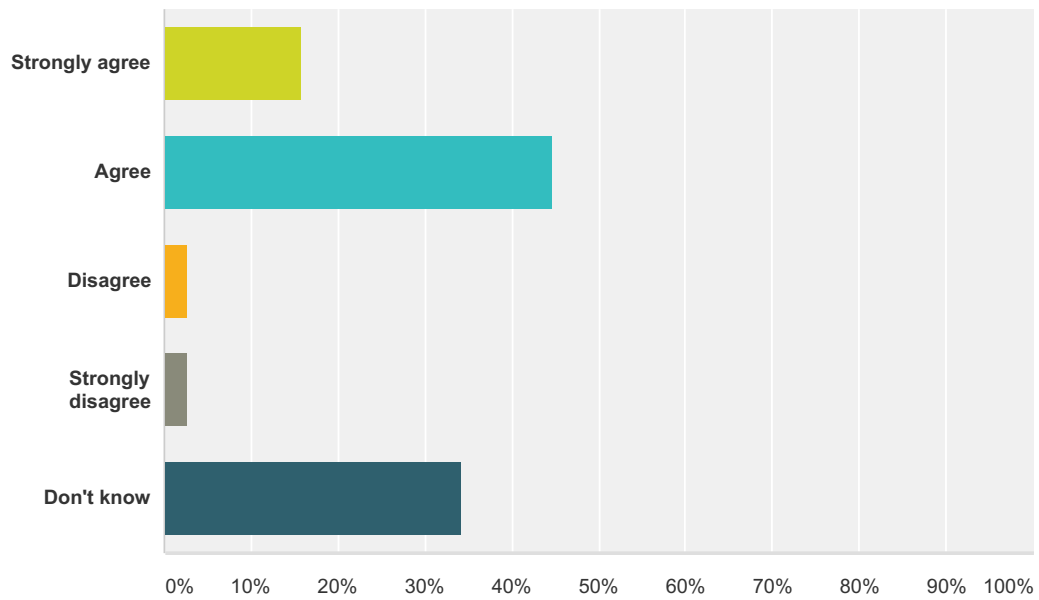

### Q12 The school deals with bullying effectively

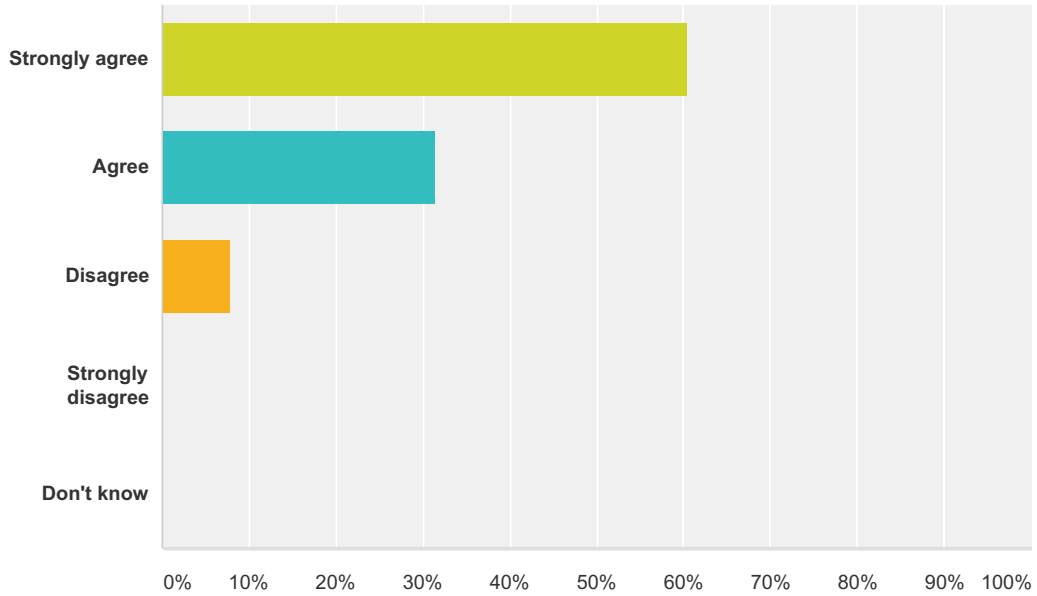

### Q13 Frieth school is welcoming and there are opportunities for parents to get involved.

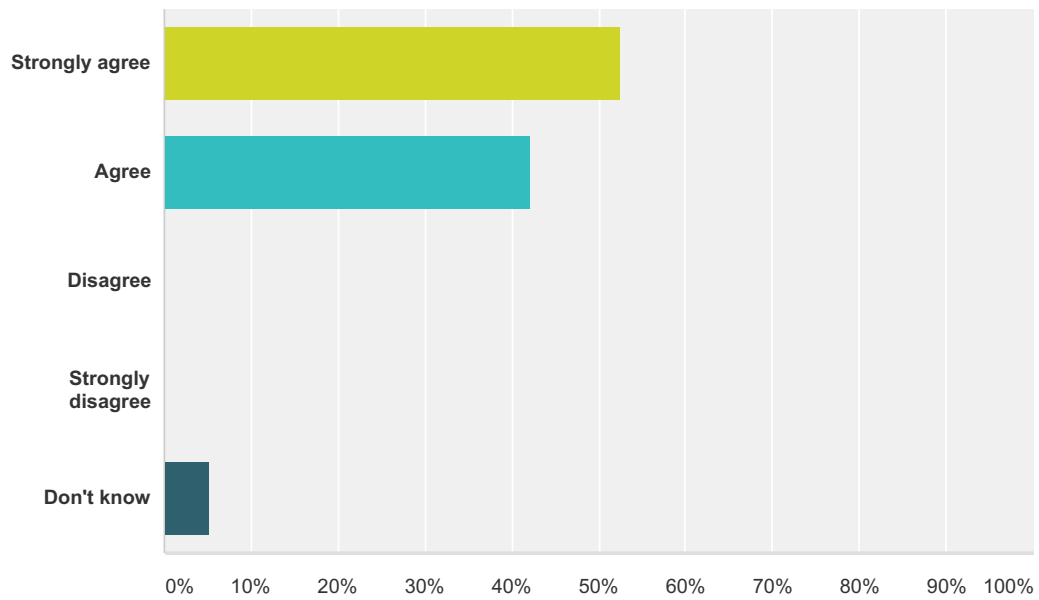

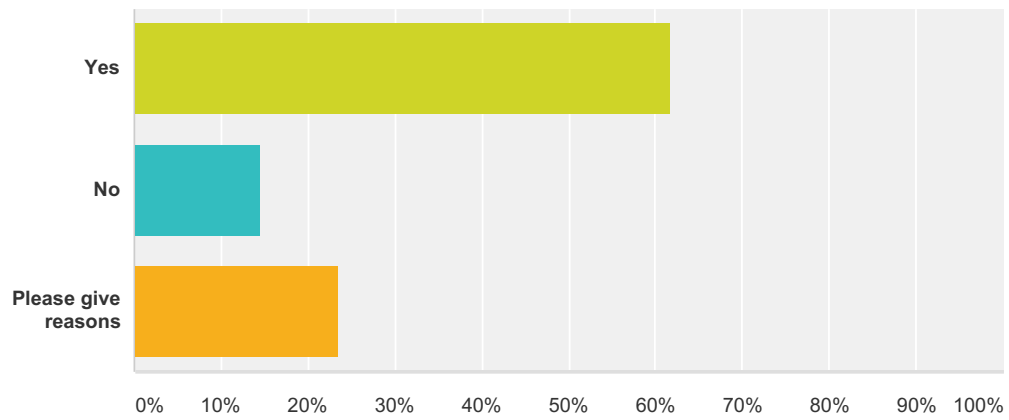

2	Guidance should be given to the parents on the role of the governors, the meetings and the role of a governor. It's very unclear what they do that benefits the school. The governor application and appointment process isn't very transparent, could be seen as bias. Why is it seen that parents should contribute to the voluntary contribution scheme and support the PTA? What are the governors doing to raise funds? rather than keep asking the families when we are being asked by the PTA. School/Governors/PTA need to be more joined up with fund raising, messages and goals. Should there a parent who sits on both the PTA and Governors who attends both meetings? Governors meetings happen but there is never any feedback to the parents telling them what is happening. All school meetings are held but the messages are unclear, except for the constant ask for money via the VC scheme. Not convinced the TAs have the right attitude towards the children and are reluctant to deal with issues in the classroom or playground if a teacher isn't available. School doesn't seem to deal with the "trouble makers" and the victims are left confused and ignored. Too much is expected of the PTA, feel the PTA are seen as an endless bank account for the school/governors. Extra money spent out of the PTA funds is spent on KS2 rather than KS1 (for example - viking visit, coaches for trips to london and the NEC).
