Specialist sports mentoring for all teachers during 1 PE lesson a week	39%	All children benefitted from specialist sport tuition and coaching increasing their skills and abilities in Gymnastics as well as teachers improving their skills in delivering high quality Gymnastics teaching
Sports Equipment purchased for after school clubs	10%	1 x table-tennis tables and football goals used for extra-curricular club to inspire confidence, raise self-esteem and promote team / partnership skills After school clubs continue to be well attended.
Sports equipment/training purchased for PE lessons and lunchtimes	6%	A higher quality of resources are used for lessons and lunchtimes demonstrating the value and regard the school places on sports. Lunchtime Controllers trained to engage pupils in games and activities at lunchtimes.
Contributions to reduce subscriptions to after school sports clubs	18%	All sports clubs were reduced by £1 per week per session to make these opportunities more accessible to all families in Summer and Autumn terms After school clubs continue to be well attended.
Football Coaching/Matches	5.5%	Sports funding paid for a football coach to work with junior children in a lunchtime football club. Matches were arranged with other school. Children experienced competition with other schools and benefitted from the skills of the football coach. Children attending the coaching and the matches were seen to make progress both in their football skills and their ability to work as a team.
PE Subject Leader identified for 2015-2016 has received training and development in preparation for new role.	1%	New PE Subject Leader prepared for new role in September. She is confident she has the skills, ability and experience to lead teachers in their professional development and make good use of next year's Sports funding.
Year 6 Sports Leaders trained to support younger children at lunchtime	4.5%	Year 6 Sports Leaders gained leadership and mentoring skills and younger children are now regularly engaging in sporting activities at lunchtime. Children have a wider variety of activities to choose from in their play.
Contribution to Adventure Playground 25% (Remainder of purchase acquired by PTA)	23%	Adventure Playground upgraded and modernised in consideration of the range of ages of the children in this school. Older children are more challenged by equipment. Children are encouraged to take measured risks.
