Climbing Wall installed on school playground	27%	All children have access to a facility that encourages them to be active, have fun and develop balance, strength and coordination. In addition to the physical nature of climbing, the technical challenge of successfully completing the traverse requires problem solving abilities combined with mental tenacity and concentration to succeed.
Sports Equipment purchased including Table Tennis tables and Basketball posts	8%	2 x table-tennis tables and 2x basketball hoops used for extra-curricular club to inspire confidence, raise self-esteem and promote team / partnership skills Numbers in both after school clubs increased.
Resources including bean bags, parachutes, seesaw, curved walkway	4%	These resources have mainly impacted on provision in the Foundation Stage outdoor classroom giving these children a wider range of opportunities to develop physically within their learning through play.
Staff Training for FS staff in provision for Physical Development	3%	The FS teacher gained many ideas for games and activities to use within PE lessons and enjoyment of PE has been increased by both adults and children.
Specialist sports coaching for all pupils	35.5%	All children benefitted from specialist sport tuition and coaching increasing their skills and abilities in all
Contributions to reduce subscriptions to after school sports clubs	19%	All sports clubs were reduced by £1 per week per session to make these opportunities more accessible to all families. An increase in participation in sports clubs after school was seen from Autumn term to Spring term and again to the Summer term.
Football Coaching/Matches	3.5%	Sports funding paid for a football coach to work with junior children in a lunchtime football club. Matches were arranged with other school. Children experienced competition with other schools and benefitted from the skills of the football coach. Children attending the coaching and the matches were seen to make progress both in their football skills and their ability to work as a team.
