Specialist sports mentoring for all teachers for 1 PE lesson a week	<b>34%</b> <b>£2,840.00</b>	Pupils have benefitted from specialist sport tuition in gymnastics and team building games. Teachers mentored in skills progression and safety, building greater confidence to deliver more challenging lessons. Standards have been raised with school teams competing successfully in the Schools Games level 2 and level 3 regional finals. Attendance in after school gymnastic club proved popular with greater awareness of the sport. Talent spotting enabled invitations to be extended to pupils for local gymnastic trials.
CPD session for Staff	<b>2%</b> <b>£200.00</b>	Twilight CPD session delivered to all staff in dance. Increased staff confidence for planning and teaching effective lessons in a safe and stimulating way.
Sports teaching resources and PE equipment purchased for PE lessons, after school sports clubs and lunchtimes activities.	<b>19%</b> <b>£1,582.60</b>	Higher quality resources used for PE lessons have contributed to the enjoyment and variety of lesson delivery. Greater stimulation during activities, especially athletic skills and gymnastics. Lunchtime Controllers trained to engage pupils in games and activities at lunchtimes.
Contributions to reduce subscriptions to after school sports clubs	<b>19.5%</b> <b>£1,645.00</b>	All sports clubs were reduced by £1 per week per session to make these opportunities more accessible to all families during the Autumn terms. After school clubs continue to be well attended.
Football and netball coaching, meetings and wider mentorship.	<b>4%</b> <b>£352.50</b>	Sports funding paid for a football coach to work with junior children during a lunchtime football club. Matches were arranged with other schools and tournaments were attended. Children experienced competition with other schools (both netball and football); benefitting from the skills of an experienced coach. Standards have been raised where children continue to make progress in their football/ netball skills, and competitive team participation. Children have been greatly motivated by a visit from the Olympic Athlete Luke Lennon-Ford.

PE Subject Leader has received ongoing training to develop role as leader and to deliver twilight training for staff(Gymnastics, athletics and ICT in sport).	<b>3%</b> <b>£234.90</b>	PE Subject Leader has benefited from ongoing training, enabling her to share knowledge and support the teaching team in terms of PE planning, skills progressions and assessment. Twilight staff training has been delivered and an ongoing ICT resource library to share knowledge, planning ideas and assessment tools has been established.
Swimming lesson coaching provision for KS2 year years 3-6	<b>18.5%</b> <b>£1,550.00</b>	All children attended specialist swimming lessons. Pupils experienced an increase in water confidence and improvement in their stroke skills. The number of children able to swim 25 metres or more has continued to grow. Water safety and survival lessons have challenged the more able swimmers.
