CPD training for all Staff DANCE WORKSHOP OCT 2016	3.5% £295.00	The underpinning knowledge of this subject has been greatly developed to support the delivery of exciting and well structure dance lessons for all age groups. Children now experience and develop a deeper knowledge of dance whilst it has also deepened their topic knowledge for their writing.
Three year on line dance resource investment	9.4% £800.00	Excellent teaching resources have brought dance up to date using modern technology and in line with the new curriculum. Teachers find this resource invaluable for providing a good structure to their lessons with appropriate progression. Children are highly motivated and experience dance within topical, traditional and modern contexts.
Orienteer map of school .	1.5% £ 125.00	Updating of the school orienteering map has enabled the re-introduction of outdoors orienteering since the school buildings expansion. Children are now enjoying a greater number of outdoor adventure experiences and there is a greater awareness of their environment. Orienteering is supporting both maths and geographical skills.
Sports equipment & resources purchased for PE lessons, after school sports clubs and lunchtime activities, including specialist orienteering equipment for KS1 and 2.	39% £3,327.45	Large investment in the replacement of many outdated sports resources has raised sports participation and enthusiasm of the children generally. Children are keen to experiment and take risks. Anecdotally, coordination skills and balance now seem more developed by the end of KS1 when compared to previous years. Children are more engaged and able to self-monitor more regularly using simple timers and measurement (e.g. in athletics), thereby creating greater interest and self- awareness.

Investment in indoor and outdoor games equipment.		Improved outdoor football facilities have enabled us to host local school league and friendly matches. Children experience greater competitive participation and benefit from better training facilities on site. It has enabled a greater number of children to attend regular training and matches, and it has raised performance levels generally. Children now also experience a wider number of indoor games activities including badminton.

Repairs and maintenance including field line marking	3.3% £277	Essential maintenance of equipment ensures continuity and avoids the disruption of sports activities.
Specialist Football Coaching and mentoring.	2.5% £215	Children have participated tournaments and local school league matches. Children have developed their skills enabling them to play and compete with increased confidence and competence. Children are now reaping the benefits of this specialist coaching in terms of developing self-awareness with competition tactics, skills and good sportsmanship.
