



## Woodleigh Federation statement of intent regarding PE expenditure for 2016 -2017 Impact

In our Federation of schools, we believe PE and sports contribute to our pupils' wellbeing and social development, working together co-operatively and as part of a team, but most importantly to their physical development. It is our belief that the skills they acquire in primary school should be skills for life and we endeavour to develop a love of sports throughout the children's time in our schools.

In all 3 schools PE and sports play an important role in the curriculum and we encourage all our pupils to participate in a variety of sports. Through our PE curriculum children have the opportunity to experience and gain skills in individual and team sports.

Through our learning community we participate in swimming galas, tag rugby, football, netball and cricket tournaments as well as dance and athletics festivals. Other competitive CLC tournaments held during the year are a Swimming Gala at Crediton Leisure Centre, Cross Country at Newton St. Cyres, Gymnastics at Landscrope and Tag Rugby at Cheriton Fitzpaine.

In March 2017 there will be a Musical/Dance performance held at the Great Hall, Exeter University, whereby all schools participate. Each school holds a successful Sports Day during the summer term. Cheriton Bishop is due to host the schools Netball and Football tournament for the Learning Community in May of each year.

Each primary school contributes to pay for a member of staff from QEAT to produce a quality fulfilling and competitive sports programme across the CLC schools. It is part of our healthy lifestyle work in schools as well as encouraging all children to participate and be active in and outside of school hours

Through joint Federation residential visits to Grenville House, Brixham, and Heatree, Dartmoor Devon our Years 5 and 6 children are able to take part in outdoor and adventurous challenges such as caving, abseiling, canoeing, kayaking and raft building.

The children also participate during the year, in Forest Schools, which teaches them basic survival life skills as well as exploring the outdoors and finding out about our wildlife.

The schools also participate in an 8 week cricket programme through Sandford Cricket Club based just outside Crediton culminating in a cricket tournament held at the cricket club in July. Sandford C.C employ an overseas player who comes into our schools to teach cricket skills to our KS2 pupils.

We also have coaching opportunities from Exeter Chiefs and Crediton Rugby club (Tag rugby for upper KS2 pupils) as well as Football coaching from West Exe Football, which is excellent CPD for teachers and support staff as well as for the pupils taking part.

These links in addition to after school and lunchtime provision provide our children with opportunities to meet, work alongside and learn from professional sports people.

This funding is calculated on pupil numbers and can only be spent on provision of PE and sport. Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

The TAs and MTAs have also received training in Positive Playtimes. Each school have Playleaders who help organise activities at lunchtimes. Some of our TAs have also trained in the Funfit programme which they run for those children who need help in refining their fine and gross motor skills. We have purchased Wake and Shake, for each school, which is a programme designed as a 10 minute fun exercise and one that focuses on developing skills for all ages as an activestart to the day with **all** children from Foundation - KS1- KS2 being involved in each of the schools across the Federation.

For the Woodleigh Federation this means approximately £24,000 of funding for each academic year and we intend to spend it:-

1. the engagement of **all** pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
2. the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. increased participation in competitive sport
